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department of state parks and cultural 1 The (a) 2 resources shall offer for sale permits that allow use of 3 the state parks, recreation areas, archeological sites and 4 historic sites. Daily use permits shall be required at Glendo, Guernsey, Curt Gowdy, Edness Kimball Wilkins, 5 Buffalo Bill, Boysen, Seminoe and Keyhole state parks and 6 Fort Bridger, South Pass City, Trail End, Fort Fetterman 7 8 and Fort Phil Kearney state historic sites, and Hawk Springs state recreation area. The department may establish 9 10 voluntary pay stations at Bear River and Hot Springs state parks to allow users of those parks to make voluntary 11 12 contributions for the use of the state parks. Persons who 13 enter or use Bear River or Hot Springs state park without 14 paying daily use fees shall not be subject to the penalties provided for in subsection (j) of this section. Overnight 15 16 camping permits shall be required at Boysen, Buffalo Bill, Curt Gowdy, Glendo, Guernsey, Keyhole, Seminoe and Sinks 17 18 Canyon state parks, Connor Battlefield state historic site, 19 Medicine Lodge state archeological site and Hawk Springs 20 state recreation area by the department during the entire 21 calendar year. Except for the lifetime permit issued without cost pursuant to subsection (n) of this section, 22

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1 the cost of the permits authorized under this section shall
2 be:

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4 (xv) Funds collected from the amenities fee authorized by paragraph (xiv) of this subsection shall be 5 deposited in an account and are continuously appropriated 6 to the department to pay the utility fees and maintenance 7 8 costs for the additional amenities offered. The remaining funds collected from the amenities fee 9 authorized by 10 paragraph (xiv) of this subsection at the end of the fiscal 11 year may be deposited in a capital construction the state 12 parks account and expended in accordance with W.S. 13 36-4-121(h). Revenues and expenditures under paragraph (xiv) of this subsection and this paragraph for each of the 14 15 immediately preceding two (2) fiscal years shall be 16 reported within the department's biennial budget request 17 submitted under W.S. 9-2-1013;

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19 The funds received by the department from the (h) 20 sale of the permits shall be deposited in a capital 21 construction account into an account within the special 22 revenue fund, hereby created as the state parks account, 23 and may be expended by the department for capital

1	construction projects, major maintenance, and site
2	interpretation such as exhibits, signage and displays as
3	approved by the legislature. <u>Interest on funds in the</u>
4	account shall accrue to the account. Not more than
5	twenty-five percent (25%) of the funds in the account in
6	any fiscal year may also be expended for general operations
7	and maintenance of outdoor recreation areas and facilities.
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9	Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2015.
