1 AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; clarifying,

2 modifying and reorganizing specified offenses against

3 public administration; amending definitions; making

4 conforming amendments; and providing for an effective date.

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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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8 **Section 1.** W.S. 34-26-207 is created to read:

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10 34-26-207. Notarial officers; issuance of certificate

11 without proper acknowledgment; penalties.

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13 A notarial officer commits a misdemeanor punishable by

14 imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, a fine of

15 not more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00), or

16 both, if he signs and affixes his seal to a certificate of

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1 acknowledgment when the party executing the instrument has

2 not acknowledged the execution of the instrument in the

3 presence of, as defined in W.S. 34-26-101(b)(xxi), the

4 notarial officer, if by law the instrument is required to

5 be recorded or filed and cannot be filed without a

6 certificate of acknowledgment signed and sealed by a

7 notarial officer.

10 6-5-105(d), 6-5-107(a) (intro) and (i), 6-5-110 by creating

Official misconduct; penalties. 12 13 14 (a) A public servant or public officer commits a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than five 15 16 thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), if, with intent to obtain a pecuniary benefit or maliciously to cause harm to another, 17 18 he knowingly: 19 20 (i) Commits an unauthorized act relating to his 21 official duties that the public servant does not have the

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authority to undertake;

Wrongful appropriation of public property; 2 penalties. 3 4 (c) This section shall not apply to limited use of 5 government property or resources for personal purposes if 6 the use does not interfere with the performance of a governmental function and either the cost or value related 7 8 to the use is de minimis or the public servant reimburses 9 the government for the cost of the use. 10 11 6-5-116. Public officer acting before qualifying; 12 penalty. 13 An elected or appointed public officer or his deputy 14 15 commits a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than 16 one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) if he performs any duty of 17 his office without taking and subscribing the oath 18 prescribed by law or before giving and filing the bond 19 required by law. This section shall not apply to training 20 and similar minor preparation for taking office. 21 22 6-5-117. Public kickback from officer demanding deputy; penalties. 23

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2 A public officer who requires a deputy appointed by him to

3 divide or pay back to the officer a part of the legal fees

4 of the deputy deputy's salary or requires any type of

5 compensation of any form in return for the deputy's

6 **continued employment** is guilty of a felony punishable by

7 imprisonment for not more than three (3) years, a fine of

8 not more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), or both.

disclosure required; penalty; definitions.

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13 (a) No public officer or public servant who invests 14 public funds for a unit of government, or who has authority to decide how public funds are invested, shall transact any 15 16 personal business with, receive any pecuniary benefit from or have any financial interest in any entity, other than a 17 18 governmental entity, unless he has disclosed the benefit or 19 interest in writing to the body of which he is a member or 20 entity for which he is working. Disclosures shall be made 21 annually in a public meeting and shall be made part of the record of proceedings. The public officer or public 22 23 servant shall make the written disclosure prior to

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1	investing any public funds in any entity, other than a
2	governmental entity, which:
