6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-802(a)(i)(intro) and 21-3-111(a)
- 9 by creating a new paragraph (xxii) are amended to read:

- 11 21-2-802. Powers and duties; teacher certification;
- 12 suspension and revocation; certification fees; disposition
- 13 of collected fees; required data submissions to department
- 14 of education.

2	(a) The board shall promulgate rules and
3	regulations:
4	
5	(i) For the certification of school
6	administrators, teachers and other personnel to require
7	either examination in specified subjects or the completion
8	of courses in approved institutions, or both. However,
9	nothing in this article shall be construed as permitting
10	the board to impose any additional requirements beyond
11	licensure in his own profession on any person licensed
12	pursuant to title 33 in order for that person to practice
13	his own profession in the schools as an employee of or
14	contractor for a school district. Board rules and
15	regulations shall require the following minimum
16	qualifications and, subject to W.S. 21-3-111(a)(xxii), any
17	additional qualifications for additional training in a
18	broad general education as the board may designate:

22	(a) The board of trustees in each school district

1 2 (xxii) Promulgate rules and regulations, which 3 shall override any inconsistent or contrary rules of the 4 professional teaching standards board promulgated under W.S. 21-2-802(a)(i), to determine the qualifications of a 5 6 certified teacher to teach specific academic content areas 7 as follows: 8 9 (A) A teacher with a major or minor degree 10 from an accredited college or university or other background or training in industrial arts, vocational or 11 12 career technical education, agriculture, animal science or 13 similar field may teach any class within or related to his 14 degree, background or training, including but not limited 15 to family and consumer sciences, business economics and 16 management, welding, drafting, woodshop, small engines, electricity and wiring, building and construction and 17 biological, physical and applied sciences, including 18 19 computer science; 20 21 (B) A teacher with a major or minor degree from an accredited college or university or other 22

background or training in social sciences, humanities or

1	similar field may teach any class within or related to his
2	degree, background or training, including but not limited
3	to United States, Wyoming or world history, anthropology,
4	sociology, psychology, political science, civics, religion,
5	philosophy, law, geography, economics, archaeology,
6	journalism and related content from humanities, mathematics
7	and natural sciences;
8	
9	(C) A teacher with a major or minor degree
10	from an accredited college or university or other
11	background or training in any of the sciences, mathematics
12	or similar field may teach any class within or related to
13	his degree, background or training, including but not
14	limited to biology, physics, chemistry, computer science,
15	mathematics, geometry, algebra, calculus, botany, health,
16	psychology and physical and applied sciences.
