Promoting individual choice in health care. Sponsored by: Senator(s) Peterson

A JOINT RESOLUTION

for

1 А JOINT RESOLUTION requesting Congress and Wyoming's 2 Congressional delegation to endorse use of health savings 3 accounts and reinsurance programs to promote individual choice in health care; to support federal legislation 4 lifting impediments and endowing states with authority to 5 6 establish health care cost and saving mechanisms; to encourage application for a state innovation waiver of 7 8 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act requirements; 9 and to promote health care billing transparency protocols.

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11 WHEREAS, Wyoming residents and businesses suffer from 12 burdensome health insurance costs resulting from Patient 13 Protection and Affordable Care Act requirements, medical 14 cost inflation, cost shifting and hidden pricing practices; 15 and

WHEREAS, federal restrictions impede Wyoming and other 1 states from implementing health care cost and saving 2 3 measures to make health care more affordable and accessible to our residents; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, uncompensated care results in health care 7 providers shifting uncompensated costs to insured patients 8 through billing add-ons; and 9 WHEREAS, an integrated state system of individual health 10 11 savings accounts, state reinsurance programs and billing 12 transparency requirements could ensure payments to health 13 care providers and diminish uncompensated care cost 14 shifting; and 15 16 WHEREAS, if Wyoming residents were given the opportunity to 17 divert an established portion of their income into 18 individually controlled health savings accounts, operated in tandem with a state reinsurance program, the programs 19 together could keep care at least as affordable as would be 20 provided under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care 21 22 Act; and

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1 WHEREAS, existing contribution limits on health savings 2 accounts unnecessarily limit the usefulness of these 3 accounts and raising the contribution limits would allow 4 for greater individual choice in health care; and

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WHEREAS, the state of Wyoming should consider using its 6 7 Medicaid program to reinsure health care costs that exceed a contributing low income, Medicaid eligible person's 8 9 health savings account, up to an established amount. The state of Wyoming could then use a reinsurance program to 10 11 manage costs, up to an established amount, for individuals 12 contributing to health savings accounts who are not 13 eligible for Medicaid. Together, the programs could 14 reinsure care that is at least as comprehensive as would be provided under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care 15 16 Act; and

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18 WHEREAS, the Employee Retirement Income Security Act 19 preempts states from having comprehensive oversight of all 20 insurance plans that may be available to their residents; 21 and

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WHEREAS, federal limitations on the importation of
prescription drugs preserve high prescription drug costs
and hinder individual choice in health care.

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5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE 6 LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

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8 Section 1. That the Wyoming Legislature calls on 9 Congress to pass legislation lifting the contribution limit 10 for individual health savings accounts, requiring greater 11 transparency in health care pricing and loosening Employee 12 Retirement Income Security Act preemption so that states 13 may regulate all insurance plans for the benefit of their 14 residents.

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16 Section 2. That the Wyoming Legislature calls on 17 Congress to pass legislation to fund reinsurance programs, 18 authorize prescription drug importation and expand 19 possibilities for states to waive federal requirements 20 under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and 21 Medicaid.

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1 Section 3. That the Wyoming Legislature urges the 2 Wyoming congressional delegation to support legislation 3 that promotes the use of health savings accounts, 4 reinsurance programs and prescription drug importation and 5 promotes individual choice in health care.

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7 Section 4. That the Wyoming Legislature encourages study and investigation of health savings account 8 9 contribution amounts, necessary reinsurance reserves, participation levels required and other data necessary to 10 11 apply for a state innovation waiver under section 1332 of 12 the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, 42 U.S.C. § 13 18001, et seq., or other similar waiver available under 14 federal law, to identify any necessary legislation to apply for and implement a waiver. 15

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17 Section 5. That the Wyoming Legislature invites 18 health insurance companies and health care providers to 19 propose legislation or rules to establish health care 20 billing transparency requirements.

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Section 6. That the Secretary of State of Wyoming transmit copies of this resolution to Wyoming's congressional delegation, the United States House Committee on Ways and Means, the United States House Committee on Energy and Commerce, the United States Senate Committee on Finance and the United States Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions.

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
