13 **23-4-201.** Definitions.

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2 (a) As used in this article:

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4 (i) "Aquatic invasive species" means exotic or

5 non-native aquatic organisms that have been determined by

6 the commission to pose a significant threat to the aquatic

7 resources, water supplies or water infrastructure of the

8 state;

10 (ii) "Conveyance" means a motor vehicle, vessel,

11 trailer or any associated equipment or containers,

12 including but not limited to live wells, ballast tanks and

13 bilge areas that may contain or carry an aquatic invasive

14 species;

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16 (iii) "Decontaminate" means to wash, drain, dry

17 or chemically, thermally or otherwise treat a conveyance in

18 accordance with rules promulgated by the commission in

19 order to remove or destroy an aquatic invasive species;

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21 (iv) "Equipment" means an article, tool,

22 implement or device capable of containing or transporting

23 water or an aquatic invasive species;

2	(v) "Inspect" means to examine a conveyance
3	pursuant to procedures established by the commission in
4	order to determine whether an aquatic invasive species is
5	present, and includes examining, draining or treating water
6	in the conveyance.

8	23-4-202. Prohibition on aquatic invasive species;
9	reporting.

11	(a) No person shall:
12	
13	(i) Possess, import, export, ship, transport or
14	cause to be possessed, imported, exported, shipped or
15	transported an aquatic invasive species, except as
16	authorized by the commission;
17	
18	(ii) Release, place, plant or cause to be
19	released, placed or planted an aquatic invasive species
20	into the waters of the state; or

22	(iii) Refuse to comply with an order issued

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2 (b) A person who knows that an aquatic invasive

3 species is present at a specific location shall immediately

4 report that knowledge and all pertinent information to the

5 commission.

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7 **23-4-203.** Enforcement.

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9 (a) In order to prevent, control, contain, monitor

10 and whenever possible eradicate aquatic invasive species

11 from the waters of this state, the commission is authorized

12 to establish, operate and maintain aquatic invasive species

13 check stations in order to inspect conveyances. The

14 commission may establish check stations at points of entry

15 to the state or other facilities and sites throughout the

16 state as necessary to carry out the provisions of this

17 article.

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- 19 (b) Upon a reasonable suspicion that an aquatic
- 20 invasive species may be present, a peace officer may:

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- 22 (i) Require the owner of a conveyance to
- 23 decontaminate the conveyance; or

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2 (ii) Inspect a conveyance and, if an aquatic

3 invasive species is determined to be present,

4 decontaminate or impound and quarantine the conveyance as

5 provided in this section.

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7 (c) The commission may restrict watercraft usage on

8 waters of the state as provided in W.S. 41-13-211(b) in

9 order to carry out the provisions of this article.

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11 (d) Any peace officer is authorized to stop and

12 inspect for the presence of aquatic invasive species any

13 conveyance:

15 (i) Immediately prior to a vessel being launched

16 onto waters of the state;

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18 (ii) Prior to departing from the waters of this

19 state or a vessel staging area;

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21 (iii) That is visibly transporting any aquatic

22 plant material; or

1 (iv) Upon a reasonable suspicion that an aquatic 2 invasive species may be present. 3 4 A peace officer is authorized to order the (e) 5 decontamination of a conveyance upon a determination that 6 an aquatic invasive species is present after conducting an 7 inspection as provided in this section. 8 9 A peace officer may impound and quarantine a 10 conveyance if: 11 12 (i) The peace officer finds that an aquatic 13 invasive species is present after conducting an inspection 14 authorized by this section; 15 16 (ii) The person transporting the conveyance refuses to submit to an inspection authorized by this 17 18 section; or 19 20 (iii) The person transporting the conveyance

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refuses to comply with an order authorized by this section

to decontaminate the conveyance.

provided in this section any person who knowingly or

willfully violates any provision of this article, may be

- 1 assessed civil penalties in an amount not to exceed the
- 2 costs incurred by the commission in enforcing the
- 3 provisions of this article. The commission may enforce the
- 4 provisions of this section, including an action for civil
- 5 penalties or injunctive relief.

- 7 **Section 2.** This act is effective immediately upon
- 8 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
- 9 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
- 10 Constitution.
