A BILL

- 1 AN ACT relating to utilities; specifying matters to be
- 2 considered and applied in certain ratemaking cases;
- 3 providing for off peak discounts and peak period
- 4 surcharges; and providing for an effective date.

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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 37-2-122 by creating new subsections
- 9 (b), (c) and (d) and by renumbering (b) as (e) is amended
- 10 to read:

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- 12 37-2-122. Matters considered in fixing rates; order
- 13 changing services or facilities.

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2 (a) In determining what are just and reasonable rates

3 the commission may take into consideration availability or

4 reliability of service, depreciation of plant,

5 technological obsolescence of equipment, expense of

6 operation, physical and other values of the plant, system,

7 business and properties of the public utility whose rates

8 are under consideration.

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10 (b) In considering the rates for a utility providing 11 electricity or natural or manufactured gas for lights, heat 12 or power, if the commission finds a utility's increased 13 costs or a portion of a utility's increased costs are due 14 primarily to costs of growth to serve an identified group 15 or groups of customers, including the new technologies 16 necessary to meet the growth requirements, any approved 17 rate increase shall reflect a differential as necessary to 18 ensure those costs are borne by the identified group or groups, unless the commission finds that all or a portion 19 of the differential is not in the public interest. 20 21 commission may disregard as de minimis or as within the 22 margin of error in growth projections differentials in 23 increased growth of five percent (5%) or less in a ten year

1 period and may disregard higher differentials upon a

2 finding that the higher differentials are within the

3 reasonable uncertainty in the projections differentials.

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5 (c) In considering the rates for a utility providing

6 electricity, if the commission finds that a portion of the

7 rates are to recover higher costs due to the imposition by

8 a non Wyoming jurisdiction of mandates relating to the type

9 of generation that may be used, the commission shall remove

10 those higher costs from the costs to be recovered from

11 Wyoming ratepayers. The commission shall, however, allow

12 the utility to recover those costs and any additional

13 premiums the utility believes prudent through a higher

14 tariff, voluntary to the customer, to encourage the

15 generation of "green" or environmentally friendly power.

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17 (d) A utility providing electricity may offer and off

18 peak discount from its approved rates to encourage usage

19 that does not increase the need for generation and

20 transmission facilities. An off peak discount pursuant to

21 this subsection is not subject to prior approval by the

22 commission. The commission shall be notified of the

23 discount before it is implemented. The commission may

request information justifying the discount and may, after 1 2 notice and opportunity for hearing, reduce the discount to ensure that the discounted rate recovers the marginal costs 3 of providing the electricity. The utility may, after 4 5 thirty (30) days public notice, including notice in the 6 utility bills affected, eliminate any off peak discount 7 pursuant to this subsection in whole or in part without approval of the commission. The commission may approve a 8

peak period usage surcharge as part of an approved utility

rate.

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12 If, upon hearing and investigation, (b) (e) 13 service or service regulation of any public utility shall 14 be found by the commission to be unjustly discriminatory or 15 unduly preferential, or any service or facility shall be 16 found to be inadequate or unsafe, or any service regulation 17 shall be found to be unjust or unreasonable, or any 18 service, facility or service regulation shall be found otherwise in any respect to be in violation of 19 provisions of this act, the commission may prescribe and 20 21 substituted therefor such service, order facility or service regulation, as it shall determine to be adequate 22 23 and safe, or just and reasonable, as the case may be and

1	otherwise	in	compliance	with	the	provisions	of	this	act,

including any provisions concerning the availability or 2

3 reliability of service. It shall be the duty of the public

utility to comply with and conform to such determination 4

5 and order of the commission.
