## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to livestock; repealing provisions for 2 participation in a national livestock identification
- 3 program and establishing a Wyoming livestock identification
- 4 and traceability program; authorizing rulemaking; providing
- 5 an appropriation; and providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-18-117 is amended to read:

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- 11 11-18-117. Confidentiality of livestock premises and
- 12 identification and traceability records; penalties.

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(a) Except as provided by subsection (b) of this 1 2 section, all records, data and information collected by the 3 state, recorded or otherwise, for the purposes of a national Wyoming livestock identification and traceability 4 program shall be confidential and are not public records 5 W.S. 16-4-201 through 16-4-205. 6 for purposes of 7 records, data and information shall may be released only upon order of the Wyoming <del>livestock board state</del> 8 9 veterinarian to appropriate governmental agencies for the purposes of a national the Wyoming livestock identification 10 11 and traceability program, disease outbreak trace or law enforcement investigation. The board state veterinarian 12 13 shall not release any records, data or information to a 14 federal agency until the agency confirms in writing that it 15 will maintain the records, data and information 16 confidential and that they are not subject to the federal Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. 17 18 Upon release by the <del>board state veterinarian</del> of any information to any other governmental entity, the board 19 20 state veterinarian shall notify the person to whom the information refers or pertains that the release has been 21 made, the name of the entity to whom the information was 22 23 released and shall provide a copy or summary of the

1 information contained in the release. The records, data

2 and information shall not be subject to discovery or

3 introduction into evidence in any civil action.

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The Wyoming <del>livestock board state veterinarian</del> 5 may release information collected for the purposes of  $\frac{\tt a}{\tt c}$ 6 7 national the Wyoming livestock identification and traceability program related to the ownership and location 8 of individual animals to the extent the information is 9 10 useful in controlling or preventing a disease outbreak or 11 to show particular animals or herds are not involved in a 12 disease outbreak. The information released may be a public 13 release or may be limited to specific individuals with a 14 need to know the information, as the <del>livestock board state</del>

veterinarian deems the circumstances require.

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(c) The Wyoming livestock board shall establish and maintain a Wyoming livestock identification and traceability program for the purpose of disease traceability. Participation in the program shall be voluntary except as otherwise provided by law. Except as provided in subsections (a) and (b) of this section, all information collected for the Wyoming livestock

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1	identification and traceability program shall be maintained
2	only with the Wyoming livestock board. The Wyoming
3	livestock identification and traceability program shall
4	incorporate existing livestock identification and
5	traceability systems to the maximum extent practicable.
6	The Wyoming livestock board shall promulgate rules and
7	regulations for the Wyoming livestock identification and
8	traceability program, including the types of identification
9	and traceability devices used, the categories and species
10	of livestock required to be identified or traced and other
11	information as determined necessary by the Wyoming
12	livestock board to protect and promote the Wyoming
13	livestock industry.
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15	(d) Nothing in this section prohibits:
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17	(i) A livestock animal producer from replacing
18	or substituting unofficial livestock identification tags on
19	his livestock for management purposes;
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21	(ii) A livestock animal producer from replacing
22	official livestock identification tags that are replaced

with the approval of the state veterinarian or his 1 2 designee. 3 person who knowingly provides false 4 <del>(c)</del>(e) A information to the Wyoming livestock board for purposes of 5 6 a national livestock identification the Wyoming livestock 7 identification and traceability program shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to one thousand 8 9 dollars (\$1,000.00), imprisonment for up to six (6) months, 10 or both. 11 12 (d)(f) A person who refuses to provide to the 13 livestock board information that is required under the 14 authority of the livestock board for purposes of  $\frac{a}{a}$ 15 mandatory national livestock identification the Wyoming 16 livestock identification and traceability program shall be quilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to one 17 thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), imprisonment for up to six 18 (6) months, or both. 19 20 21 (q) A person who, with the intent of avoiding 22 compliance with the Wyoming livestock identification and traceability program, removes an official livestock 23

1 identification tag from any animal without the express

2 permission of the state veterinarian shall be guilty of a

3 <u>misdemeanor</u> punishable by a fine of up to one thousand

4 dollars (\$1,000.00), imprisonment for up to six (6) months

5 or both.

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7 Section 2. There is appropriated three hundred fifteen thousand dollars (\$315,000.00) from the general 8 9 fund to the Wyoming livestock board. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date 10 11 of this act and ending June 30, 2012. This appropriation 12 shall only be expended for the purpose of implementing and 13 maintaining the Wyoming livestock identification program. 14 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any 15 any unexpended, unobligated funds 16 other purpose and remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided 17 by law on June 30, 2012. A request of six hundred thirty 18 thousand dollars (\$630,000.00) shall be included in the 19 Wyoming livestock board's 2013-2014 standard biennial 20 budget request for purposes of continuing funding of this 21 22 program.

Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2011.
