A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the state fair; eliminating certain
- 2 qualifications for collecting premium awards; extending the
- 3 time to remove improvements; clarifying duties of the state
- 4 fair manager; making conforming amendments; repealing the
- 5 allocation of funds to county fair associations; and
- 6 providing for an effective date.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-10-101 through 11-10-108,
- 11 11-10-111 and 11-10-115 are amended to read:

- 1 11-10-101. Department of agriculture to conduct;
- where held; purpose; awards generally.

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- 4 The department of agriculture shall hold an annual state
- 5 fair at Douglas, Wyoming, where all important products of
- 6 the state shall be recognized according to merit by
- 7 premiums or rewards for excellence offered out of an
- 8 appropriation provided by the legislature. No person shall
- 9 collect any award until he furnishes to the department, if
- 10 requested, a complete history in writing of how the exhibit
- 11 was produced and all other information concerning the entry
- 12 that would be of interest or benefit to the general public.

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14 11-10-102. Supervision generally.

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- 16 The general charge and supervision of the state fair is
- 17 under the director of the department of agriculture. The
- 18 director may employ a competent manager and other employees
- 19 necessary for the proper conduct and management of the fair
- 20 <u>and fairgrounds</u>. The director is responsible for the proper
- 21 disbursement of all funds appropriated for the operation
- 22 and maintenance of the fair.

1 11-10-103. Reversion of fairgrounds to donor.

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- 3 If the state fails for three (3) consecutive years to hold
- 4 a state fair, the lands used for the purpose of a state
- 5 fair shall revert to the person donating them, the state
- 6 having the right to remove all buildings, fences and
- 7 improvements of whatever nature within three (3)twenty-four
- 8 (24) months after the date on which the fair should have
- 9 been held. All buildings, fences and improvements remaining
- 10 on the land after the expiration of the three (3) twenty-
- 11 four (24) months shall become the property of the owner of
- 12 the land.

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14 **11-10-104**. Catalogues.

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- 16 At least three (3) months before any annual fair, the
- 17 manager, upon approval of the director, of the department
- 18 of agriculture shall have a catalogue prepared and copies
- 19 sent to the county clerks of the state available for
- 20 distribution to any person requesting it.

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22 **11-10-105**. **Entry fees**.

- 1 A fee may be charged for any in-state or out-of-state
- 2 exhibit to be entered in the state fair at an amount set by
- 3 the manager, subject to approval by the director of the
- 4 department of agriculture and the board.

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6 11-10-106. Admission charges; other revenues.

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- 8 (a) There shall be charged at the gates of the
- 9 fairground an admission fee to be set by the manager,
- 10 subject to approval by the director and the board. An extra
- 11 charge may be made for seats in the grandstand or other
- 12 structure providing added comforts. The charge for vehicles
- 13 driven or stock ridden into the grounds may be fixed by the
- 14 manager, subject to approval by the director and the board.
- 15 All fees collected shall be deposited in the Wyoming state
- 16 fair account.

- 18 (b) The department of agriculture may receive any
- 19 money or property of any kind or character donated,
- 20 granted or bequeathed for any activities of the state fair.
- 21 Monies shall be credited to the state fair account. The
- 22 department shall submit an annual report to the joint

1 appropriations committee itemizing all gifts, income and

2 expenditures under this subsection.

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4 11-10-107. Power of board to acquire land; authority

5 to make rules and regulations; renting and use of

6 fairgrounds; gambling and liquor prohibited.

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The board may acquire by donation or lease in the name of 8 9 the state any lands necessary for conducting the state 10 fair, and may make all rules and regulations necessary for 11 the conduct and government of the exhibitions, the sale of privileges, and the proper control, operation and conduct 12 13 of the state fair not inconsistent with the constitution 14 and laws of this state. The manager, under the authority 15 granted by the director and the board may rent out or 16 donate the use of the state fairgrounds for stabling and training stock and holding stock sales. The grounds may be 17 18 used free of charge for encampment grounds for the state militia under the direction of the adjutant general of the 19 state. The manager, under the authority granted by the 20 21 director and the board, in its discretion may permit the 22 grounds and facilities to be used for other purposes and

may charge fees as it deems necessary to pay the expenses

1 of maintaining the grounds and facilities. The board shall

2 not permit any gambling device of any nature to be operated

3 on the grounds, or permit any unlawful betting, or permit

4 any intoxicating liquors to be sold thereon except as

5 provided by W.S. 12-4-505.

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7 11-10-108. Rodeos; generally.

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9 The director of the department of agriculture and the board

10 may provide a rodeo as part of the state fair program,

11 provided there is no restriction on any Wyoming resident

12 who desires to participate in the rodeo other than the

13 prescribed entry fee, unless the restriction is required by

14 a sanctioning body as part of the terms and conditions to

15 sanction the rodeo. Any contract entered into with any

16 person to provide entertainment under this section is void

17 if it in any manner excludes a Wyoming resident from

18 participation in the entertainment because of membership or

19 nonmembership in any organization or group.

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21 **11-10-111**. Reports.

1 The director of the department of agriculture shall make

2 reports as required by W.S. 9-2-1014 in regard to the state

3 fair.

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5 11-10-115. State fair advisory board; membership.

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7 There is created the state fair advisory board (a) which shall serve as advisor to the board of agriculture on 8 the operation of the state fair and the operation and 9 10 maintenance of the state fairgrounds. The state fair 11 advisory board shall consist of ten (10) members, one (1) 12 member appointed by each of the seven (7) members of the 13 board of agriculture appointed pursuant to W.S. 14 11-2-102(b), one (1) member appointed by the Converse 15 county board of commissioners, one (1) member appointed by the dean of the University of Wyoming college of 16 agriculture from the Wyoming cooperative extension service, 17 18 and one (1) member selected by the Wyoming vocational agriculture teachers association from its membership. The 19 state fair advisory board members shall receive no salary 20 in the performance of their duties but shall receive 21 22 mileage and per diem the same as state employees as provided by W.S. 9-3-102. 23

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2	(b) The state fair advisory board member appointed by
3	the Converse county board of commissioners, the <u>state fair</u>
4	advisory board member appointed by the dean of the
5	University of Wyoming college of agriculture and the <u>state</u>
6	fair advisory board member selected by the Wyoming
7	vocational agriculture teachers association shall serve a
8	four (4) year term. All other state fair advisory board
9	members shall serve at the pleasure of the person who
10	appointed the state fair advisory board member and in no
11	event shall the term of any state fair advisory member
12	exceed the corresponding term of the appointing board of
13	agriculture member.

Section 2. W.S. 11-10-110 is repealed.

Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2011.
