## A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to state parks; providing for user fees to
be collected at the time of vehicle registrations;

providing for a waiver of the additional fee; providing for
distribution and use of additional fee; eliminating

collection of daily use fees at state parks, historic
sites, state recreation areas and state archeological sites
for Wyoming residents; and providing for an effective date.

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Section 1. W.S. 31-3-101(a) by creating a new paragraph (iii), 31-3-103 by creating a new subsection (m)

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and 36-4-121(a) by creating a new paragraph (xvii) are
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    amended to read:
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         31-3-101. Registration fees; exemptions.
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         (a) Except as otherwise provided, the following fees
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    shall accompany each application for the registration of a
    vehicle:
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              (iii) A state parks, historic sites, recreation
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    area and archeological site user fee of five dollars
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    ($5.00) shall be collected for all passenger cars
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    registering under paragraph (ii) (A) of this subsection and
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    non commercial vehicles registering under paragraph (ii) (E)
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    of this subsection at the time of registration. A person
    who registers such a vehicle may, at the time of annual
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    registration make a written election not to pay the five
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    dollars ($5.00) state parks user fee authorized under this
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    paragraph. If a written election is made, the fee required
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    in this paragraph shall not be collected.
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         31-3-103. Distribution of fees; refunds.
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(m) The fees collected pursuant to W.S. 31-3-1 2 101(a)(iii) shall be distributed to a special revenue fund 3 to be deposited as follows: 4 5 (i) Fifty percent (50%) shall be deposited in an 6 operation and maintenance account within the special 7 revenue fund for purposes of providing for operation and maintenance at state parks, recreation areas, 8 9 archaeological sites and historic sites; and 10 11 (ii) Fifty percent (50%) shall be deposited in 12 the capital construction account created by W.S. 36-4-13 121(h). 14 15 36-4-121. Permits to use state parks, recreation areas and historic sites. 16 17 18 (a) The department of state parks and cultural resources shall offer for sale permits that allow use of 19 the state parks, recreation areas, archeological sites and 20 historic sites. Except as otherwise provided by law, daily 21 22 use permits shall be required at Glendo, Guernsey, Curt

Gowdy, Edness Kimball Wilkins, Buffalo Bill, Boysen,

Seminoe and Keyhole state parks and Fort Bridger, South 1 2 Pass City, Trail End, Fort Fetterman and Fort Phil Kearney 3 state historic sites, and Hawk Springs state recreation area. The department may establish voluntary pay stations 4 at Bear River and Hot Springs state parks to allow users of 5 those parks to make voluntary contributions for the use of 6 7 the state parks. Persons who enter or use Bear River or Hot Springs state park without paying daily use fees shall not 8 be subject to the penalties provided for in subsection (j) 9 10 of this section. Overnight camping permits shall be 11 required at Boysen, Buffalo Bill, Curt Gowdy, Glendo, 12 Guernsey, Keyhole, Seminoe and Sinks Canyon state parks, 13 Connor Battlefield and Fort Fetterman state historic site 14 sites, Medicine Lodge state archeological site and Hawk 15 Springs state recreation area by the department during the 16 entire calendar year. Except for the lifetime permit issued without cost pursuant to subsection (n) of this section or 17 18 as otherwise provided by law, the cost of the permits authorized under this section shall be: 19

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21 (i) Thirty three dollars (\$33.00) per calendar
22 year for a resident annual daily use permit and Fifty-three
23 dollars (\$53.00) for a nonresident annual daily use permit

to designated state parks, historic sites, archeological 1 2 sites and recreation areas, valid for the holder and 3 occupants of the holder's vehicle, provided resident permits purchased pursuant to this paragraph between 4 January 1 through February 15 of each year shall cost 5 6 twenty-seven dollars (\$27.00) and nonresident permits 7 purchased during the same period pursuant to this paragraph between January 1 through February 15 of each year shall 8 9 cost forty-six dollars (\$46.00); 10 11 (iii) Except as provided under paragraph (a) (v) 12 of this section, four dollars (\$4.00) for residents and six 13 dollars (\$6.00) for nonresidents for the daily use fee for 14 designated state parks, archeological sites and recreation areas, valid for the date of purchase for the holder and 15 occupants of the holder's vehicle and for the holder 16 entering the park or area by bicycle, horseback or on foot; 17 18 (iv) Except as provided under paragraph (a) (v) 19 of this section, two dollars (\$2.00) 20 per residents and four dollars (\$4.00) 21 per person for 22 nonresidents for the daily use fee for designated state historic sites, valid for the date of purchase for the 23

1 holder only. The fee is not required for persons under the

2 age of eighteen (18) years;

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4 (xvii) Residents shall not be required to pay a

5 daily use fee for access to state parks, historic sites,

6 recreation areas or archeological sites. Other fees for

7 the use of state parks, such as overnight camping fees, are

8 still chargeable and may be collected by the department.

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The funds received by the department from the 10 (h) 11 sale of the permits under this section and received 12 pursuant to W.S. 31-3-103(m)(ii) shall be deposited in a 13 capital construction account and may be expended by the 14 department for capital construction projects, major maintenance, and site interpretation such as exhibits, 15 16 signage and displays and for the administration of the fee 17 program including the cost of purchasing permits, fee 18 envelopes, signs and administering reservations as approved

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by the legislature.

21 (n) Any resident disabled veteran who receives fifty 22 percent (50%) or more service connected disability 23 compensation from the United States department of veteran's

1	affairs may apply to the department for a lifetime permit
2	authorizing the use of state parks, recreation areas,
3	archeological sites and historic sites without payment of
4	any daily use, overnight camping or other fee authorized to
5	be charged pursuant to this section. Only one (1) permit
6	shall be issued to any qualified applicant under this
7	subsection and shall be valid for the applicant and for all
8	occupants of the applicant's vehicle. In addition to
9	information and other application procedural requirements
10	prescribed by rule and regulation of the department,
11	application for the lifetime permit shall include proof of
12	residency and certification of the service connected
13	disability. The lifetime permit is valid as long as the
14	holder is a Wyoming resident. A permit under this
15	subsection shall be issued to an eligible applicant without
16	the imposition of a fee.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2011. 18
