A BILL

for

1	AN ACT relating to the administration of government,
2	Medicaid and the 2010 federal health care reform; providing
3	for a study related to options for reconfiguring of the
4	Medicaid program; requiring a report; providing report
5	requirements; providing an appropriation; and providing for
6	an effective date.
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8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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10	Section 1.
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12	(a) The governor shall conduct a study to develop
13	estimates of the cost of the reconfiguring of the Medicaid

programs currently operating and those mandated by the 1 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, P.L. 111-148, 2 and the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 3 2010, P.L. 111-152, hereinafter referred to collectively as 4 health care reform acts." The governor shall 5 "the designate a study oversight organization, which may be a 6 7 state agency, more than one (1) state agency or an ad hoc organization created by the governor to conduct the study. 8

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10 (b) The oversight organization shall have the 11 authority to contract with experts and consultants as may 12 be useful in conducting the study and making the cost 13 estimates.

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15 (c) The study shall be subject to the following:16

(i) study shall examine each 17 The Medicaid 18 program that provides healthcare paid by the state and federal government and determine the total annual cost of 19 healthcare benefits per enrolled persons who are part of 20 each program. The cost shall be broken down by state 21 share, federal share, client share and any other costs, 22

administrative or otherwise hidden, that are part of each
 program;

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4 (ii) The study shall examine the broad 5 categories, including physical, mental and dental health, 6 of the benefits associated with each program and account 7 for the cost of each benefit;

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9 (iii) The study shall collect information from 10 insurance companies to determine premium costs of private 11 insurance providing equivalent or nearly equivalent 12 benefits for similarly aged clients;

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14 (iv) The study shall summarize the basic insurance policy benefits package that is available using a 15 median value of individual and group health insurance 16 premium paid in the state of Wyoming and compare the 17 18 benefits with those provided by the various Medicaid 19 programs;

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(v) The study shall compare the cost of the healthcare portion of each Medicaid program in paragraph (i) of this subsection with the premium and other costs of

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private insurance premiums and other associated costs were
 the Medicaid clients covered by private insurance;

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4 (vi) The study shall determine the cost of the 5 state supporting Medicaid-like insurance premiums for 6 individuals who would otherwise be eligible for Medicaid 7 programs;

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9 (vii) The study shall determine the cost of the 10 state supporting Medicaid-like insurance premiums using a 11 sliding scale of reasonable co-pays by clients whose income 12 is greater than one hundred percent (100%) of the federal 13 poverty level up to the level currently established for the 14 various Medicaid programs and up to the level proposed in 15 the federal health care reform acts;

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17 (viii) The study shall report the total 18 appropriations necessary to support each program by fiscal 19 year through the 2019-2020 biennium;

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(ix) The study shall discuss the feasibility and procedure necessary to replace any of the current health insurance Medicaid programs with state funded private

premium assistance programs, if the results of the study 1 indicate that the state funded private premium assistance 2 program could be established for a cost that is within one 3 hundred twenty percent (120%) of the total current state 4 appropriations for the respective Medicaid 5 program. Variances in benefits, as well as sliding scale co-pays, 6 7 may be considered to achieve near equivalence. Each program shall be considered independently; 8

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10 (x) The study shall separately identify 11 additional anticipated costs to each program affected by 12 proposed coverage limit changes included in the federal 13 health care reform acts, and those shall be noted and 14 considered as additions to predicted future costs;

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16 (xi) The study shall include any proposals that 17 reveal themselves in the course of the study that have the 18 possibility to provide safety-net health insurance coverage 19 for the various Medicaid groups which result in a savings 20 to the state or enhanced coverage for recipients at a 21 lesser or near neutral cost.

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1 (d) In conducting the study and reporting its 2 results, the oversight organization and any contractors 3 shall consider that the study is expected to be used:

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(i) To assist the people, the governor and the 5 legislature of Wyoming in deciding whether to accept the 6 7 new mandatory eligibility and other requirements of the Medicaid program under the health care reform acts, to 8 withdraw from that program and establish an independent 9 State supported safety net program for healthcare by 10 11 setting forth the financial consequences of that decision or to seek a waiver from CMMS to reconfigure the methods 12 13 that safety net programs are offered by cooperative 14 agreement between the state and federal government;

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(ii) executive 16 То assist the branch and legislative budget staff making accurate 17 in budget estimates for the cost of Medicaid reconfiguration, if 18 accepted; 19

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(iii) To help form the basis for an application
for a Medicaid waiver covering all or part of the current
and newly eligible population, the purpose of the waiver

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1 being to reduce the cost of the eligibility expansion by 2 using additional cost control techniques;

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4 (iv) To allow legislators and members of the 5 public who are not expert in Medicaid costs to make their 6 own cost estimates using data from the study and varying 7 key assumptions, including especially estimates of the 8 respective federal and state cost shares.

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10 (e) Before letting any contract, the oversight 11 organization shall submit a draft of the request for 12 proposal or other document governing the contract to the 13 joint labor, health and social services interim committee 14 and the joint appropriations interim committee.

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The study shall be completed by September 1, (f) 16 2012, unless the governor requires an earlier completion 17 date, and submitted to the joint labor, health and social 18 services interim committee and the joint appropriations 19 interim committee. The oversight organization shall be 20 prepared to present the results of the study to these 21 committees before 22 the 2013 general session of the legislature. 23

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2 (g) The study shall be available to the people and 3 the legislature on at least one relevant website and in 4 hard copy.

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6 2. There is appropriated three Section hundred 7 thousand dollars (\$300,000.00) from the general fund to the qovernor's office. This appropriation shall be for the 8 period beginning with the effective date of this act and 9 ending June 30, 2013. This appropriation shall only be 10 11 expended for the purpose of conducting the study and preparing the report required by this act. Notwithstanding 12 any other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be 13 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any 14 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from 15 this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 16 2013. This appropriation shall not be included in the 17 18 governor's 2013-2014 standard biennial budget request.

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20 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon 21 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 22 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 23 Constitution.
