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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 22-25-106(a), (b)(i) through (iii),
- 9 (c) and (d), 22-25-107(a)(intro), by creating new
- 10 subsections (b) and (c) and by renumbering (b) as (d),
- 11 22-25-108(a), (b)(intro), (ii) and (c) and 22-25-109 are
- 12 amended to read:

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14 22-25-106. Filing of campaign reports.

1 (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (g) of 2 this section and in addition to other statements required 3 by this subsection, every candidate shall file a fully 4 itemized statement of receipts and expenditures at least 5 seven (7) days before any primary, general or special election with information required by this subsection 6 7 current to the fourteenth day before the election. Except as otherwise provided in subsection (g) of this section, 8 9 every candidate, whether successful or not, shall file a 10 fully itemized statement of receipts and expenditures 11 within ten (10) days after any primary, general or special 12 election. The statement Every unsuccessful candidate in any 13 primary election shall file a fully itemized statement of 14 receipts and expenditures within ten (10) days after the primary election. Statements under this subsection shall 15 forth the 16 full and complete record of receipts set 17 including cash, goods or services and of actual and promised expenditures, including all identifiable expenses 18 as set forth in W.S. 22-25-103. The date of each receipt of 19 20 twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or more, any expenditure or 21 obligation, the name of the person from whom received or to 22 whom paid and the purpose of each expenditure or obligation shall be listed. All receipts under twenty-five dollars 23 (\$25.00) shall be reported but need not be itemized. Should 24

1 the accumulation of receipts from an individual exceed the

2 twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) threshold, all receipts from

3 that individual shall be itemized. Receipts, expenditures

4 and obligations itemized in a statement filed by a

5 political action committee, a candidate's campaign

committee or by a political party central committee need 6

not be itemized in a candidate's statement except by total 7

with a reference to the statement. The statement Statements 8

9 under this subsection shall be filed with those officers as

10 provided in W.S. 22-25-107. The statement may be filed by

11 facsimile transmission if the original is postmarked on the

day the facsimile is sent. 12

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14 (b) Reports of itemized statements of receipt and

expenditures, and statements of termination shall be made 15

with the appropriate filing officers specified under W.S. 16

17 22-25-107 and in accordance with the following:

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19 (i) Except as otherwise provided in this

20 section, any political action committee, candidate's

21 campaign committee, or any political action committee

22 formed under federal law or the law of another state that

contributes to a Wyoming political action committee or to a

candidate's campaign committee, and any other organization 24

1 supporting or opposing any ballot proposition which expends

2 any funds in any primary, general or special election shall

3 file an itemized statement of receipts and expenditures at

4 least seven (7) days before the election current to the

5 fourteenth day before the election and shall also file a

statement of receipts and expenditures within ten (10) days 6

7 after the a general or special election;

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9 (ii) A committee formed after an election to 10 campaign expenses incurred during a previous 11 election and any political action or candidate's campaign 12 committee which has previously filed a statement 13 receipts and expenditures and has not filed a statement of termination shall file an itemized statement of receipts 14 and expenditures on July 1 and December 31 of each 15

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odd-numbered year;

(iii) All candidates and committees shall continue to make the biannual reports required under this subsection until the committee terminates and the candidate or committee files a statement of termination with the appropriate filing officer. A statement of termination may be filed upon retirement of all debts;

1 (c) All statements required by subsection (b) of this section shall be signed by both the chairman and treasurer. 2 3 The statements shall set forth the full and complete record 4 of receipts including cash, goods or services and of actual 5 and promised expenditures. The date of each receipt of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or more, any expenditure or 6 obligation, the name of the person from whom received or to 7 whom paid and the purpose of each expenditure or obligation 8 9 shall be listed. Nothing in this subsection shall 10 construed to require the disclosure of the names of 11 individuals paid to circulate an initiative or referendum 12 petition. All receipts under twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) 13 shall be reported but need not be itemized. Should the accumulation of receipts from an individual exceed the 14 twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) threshold, all receipts from 15 16 individual shall be itemized. Ιf that the receipts, 17 expenditures or obligations were for more than one (1) amounts attributable to each shall 18 candidate, the 19 itemized separately. The statement may be filed by 20 facsimile transmission if the original is postmarked on the 21 day the facsimile is sent.

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23 (d) The chairman of each political party central 24 committee for the state or county, or an officer of the

1 party designated by him, shall file an itemized statement 2 of receipts of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or more, and any expenditures and obligations. The itemized statement 3 4 shall be filed. The statement may shall be filed by 5 facsimile transmission within ten (10) days after a general 6 or special election. provided an original signed statement is sent by mail on the same day. The statement shall report 7 all receipts, expenditures and obligations relating to 8 9 campaign expenses, including normal operating expenses. All receipts under twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be 10 reported but need not be itemized. Should the accumulation 11 12 of receipts from an individual exceed the twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) threshold, all receipts from 13 14 individual shall be itemized. It shall attribute all campaign receipts, expenses and obligations to a specific 15 16 candidate only if the campaign receipts, expenses and 17 obligations can be specifically identified to that specific candidate to the exclusion of other candidates on the 18 ticket. A copy of the statement shall be furnished to each 19 20 candidate identified in the statement within ten (10) days 21 after the general or special election.

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22-25-108. Failure of candidate or committee to file 8 9 statement.

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(a) A candidate who fails to file, within the time 11 required, a full and complete itemized statement of 12 receipts and expenditures shall receive a notice by 13 certified mail return receipt 14 requested stating that 15 failure to file the statement within three (3) calendar days of receipt of the notice shall result in a vacancy in 16 17 nomination or a vacancy in office, as the case may be and may be charged with a criminal offense as provided by W.S. 18 19 22-26-112 have his name printed on a list drafted by the 20 appropriate filing office specified under W.S. 22-25-107. 21 The list shall immediately be posted in the filing office 22 and made available to the public. If he fails a candidate has failed to file within three (3) calendar a full and 23 24 complete itemized statement of receipts and expenditures

1 for more than fourteen (14) days after receipt of notice it 2 is due, he shall not receive a certificate of nomination, 3 or election, nor shall he enter upon the duties of the 4 office, as the case may be and may be charged with a 5 misdemeanor as provided by W.S. 22-26-112. A late filing

fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall accompany all 6

7 late reports.

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9 In addition to any other penalty provided by law, (b) a candidate who fails to file the statement required by 10 11 subsection (a) of this section within one (1) month of 12 receipt of the notice provided the report due date is 13 ineligible to run as a candidate for any state or local 14 office for which a statement is required by W.S. 22-25-106 15 until:

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17 (ii) The person has filed the required statement. and has paid the late filing fee assessed under 18 19 subsection (a) of this section.

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21 (c) Any political action committee which fails to 22 file a report as required shall be sent notice by the secretary of state, by certified mail return receipt 23 24 requested or personal service in accordance with rule 4 of

the Wyoming Rules of Civil Procedure, stating that failure 1 2 to file the statement within three (3) calendar days of 3 receipt of the notice may result in the filing of criminal 4 charges against the committee's officers responsible for 5 the filing. A late filing fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall accompany all late reports. Any officer of a 6 7 political action committee who is responsible for filing a report and who knowingly and willfully fails to file a 8 9 required or who knowingly and willfully report as subscribes to, makes or causes to be made a false report is 10 11 guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment not to exceed two (2) years. 12

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22-25-109. Reporting candidates in violation.

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The secretary of state shall report the names of all 16 17 candidates in violation of the Election Code of the state of Wyoming to the attorney general or to the district 18 attorney for appropriate action. The secretary of state 19 20 shall publish a list of those persons violating W.S. 21 22-25-106, once in a newspaper in general circulation 22 throughout the state.
