Developmental preschool funding.

A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to education; providing for funding of
- 2 developmental preschool programs, as specified; providing
- 3 requirements for contracts with developmental preschools,
- 4 as specified; requiring reports; granting rulemaking
- 5 authority; providing appropriations; and providing for an
- 6 effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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10 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-706 is created to read:

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12 21-2-706. Developmental preschool funding.

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- 14 (a) Expenditures by the division for developmental
- 15 preschool services shall be subject to the following:

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1 (i) Contractual payments to developmental preschool service providers shall be sufficient for the 2 3 providers to provide adequate services for children age birth through five (5) years of age with developmental 4 5 disabilities and delays, including compensation levels for early childhood special educators, occupational therapists, 6 physical therapists and speech-language therapists that are 7 competitive with local school district compensation levels 8

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for those categories;

(ii) Contractual payments to developmental preschool service providers shall be sufficient for the providers to pay for professional development activities of their professional employees and for a statewide program to identify children age birth through five (5) years of age in need of developmental preschool services;

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(iii) Contracts with developmental preschool
service providers shall require that the providers adopt
evidence-based best practices, as defined by the division
by rule and regulation.

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23 (b) For purposes of calculating payments to service 24 providers for the subsequent fiscal year and preparing the

1 division's standard budget for the subsequent biennium,

2 children age birth through five (5) years of age with

3 developmental disabilities who are subject to an

4 individualized education program or an individualized

5 family service plan shall be estimated as of December 1 of

6 the current fiscal year, and that number shall be

7 multiplied by seven thousand two hundred six dollars

8 (\$7,206.00) per child per year.

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10 (c) In preparing the standard budget amount following

11 the 2007-2008 biennium and thereafter, the amount described

12 in subsection (b) shall be increased by the most recent

13 external cost adjustment as enacted by the legislature

14 pursuant to W.S. 21-13-309(o)(i) and (r).

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16 Section 2.

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18 (a) The developmental disabilities division of the

19 department of health shall report to the select committee

20 on developmental programs or, if that committee no longer

21 exists, to the joint education interim committee and the

22 joint labor, health and social services interim committee

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23 as follows:

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1 (i) Ву October 1, 2006, and every year thereafter, regarding: 2 3 4 (A) Whether compensation levels for early 5 childhood special educators, occupational therapists, physical therapists and speech-language therapists 6 competitive with local school district salaries, and the 7 effect of school district recalibration on those salaries; 8 9 Whether funding levels are sufficient 10 (B) to provide required services for all eligible children; 11 12 13 (C) Whether services for children with disabilities are provided in 14 developmental least а restrictive environment; 15 16 17 (D) Whether developmental preschools have adopted evidence-based best practices; 18 19 20 Whether developmental preschools (E) 21 meeting parent expectations and children are making 22 sufficient and measurable progress based upon satisfaction surveys and student performance measurements. 23

If a program is not providing satisfactory results, the

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1 board of directors of the program shall submit a remedial

2 plan to the division that details the steps that will be

3 taken to correct the deficiencies. The division shall

4 report the results of the parent satisfaction surveys and

5 student performance measurements as well as the number of

6 regions out of compliance with the above performance

7 measures, the number of remedial plans submitted to the

8 division and the number of regions correcting noncompliance

9 within the past year. For the October 1, 2006 report only,

10 the division shall submit a plan for implementation,

11 including a description of the parent survey instrument to

12 be used in successive years and the method to be used for

13 assessing student performance rather than the outcome

14 measures.

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16 (ii) By October 1, 2006, regarding:

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18 (A) The progress of a mental health pilot

19 project and the cost of integrating mental health services

20 in developmental preschools;

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22 (B) The capital construction needs of

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23 developmental preschools in the state.

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1 Section 3. The department of education shall report

2 to the select committee on developmental programs or, if

3 that committee no longer exists, to the joint education

4 interim committee and the joint labor, health and social

5 services interim committee by October 1, 2006 on the amount

6 of funds each school district is providing to the

7 developmental preschools to conduct child find activities

8 for children from birth through five (5) years of age.

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10 Section 4. In addition to other funds any 11 appropriated for developmental preschool programs, up to eleven million one hundred thirteen thousand one hundred 12 13 seventy-one dollars (\$11,113,171.00) is appropriated to the department of health from the general fund for the biennium 14 commencing July 1, 2006 for contractual payments to 15 developmental preschools to fulfill the purposes of this 16

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act.

Section 5. There is appropriated two hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$220,000.00) from the general fund to department of health for purposes of administration of this act. Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008, 9-2-1012(e) and 9-4-207(a), any unobligated, unexpended funds remaining from this appropriation shall not revert on June 30, 2006

and is hereby appropriated to the department of health for 1

2 the period beginning July 1, 2006 and ending June 30, 2008

for purposes of administration of this act. 3

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5 Section 6. This act is effective immediately upon

completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 6

7 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the

Constitution. 8
