(c) In the event a person has recovered the three (3) times total actual damages sustained due to a violation of this act under subsection (b) of this section, then no other person, firm, private corporation or trade 15 association shall have the right to maintain an action against the violator for the same act or acts; provided, 17 however, that other injured persons, firms, private 18 corporations or trade associations may maintain an action 19 against the party who recovered three (3) times the total 20 21 damages to recover a proportionate share thereof, less a proportionate share of reasonable attorneys' fees and 23 costs, where there is a reasonably foreseeable physical and

1 economic causal nexus between their injury and the same act

2 or acts for which recovery was made.

4 (b) (d) Any person who, either as director, officer or

5 agent of any firm or corporation or as agent of any person,

6 violating the provisions of this act, assists or aids,

7 directly or indirectly, in such violation shall be

9 corporation for whom or which he acts.

11 (c)(e) In the prosecution of any person as officer,

12 director or agent, it shall be sufficient to allege and

13 prove the unlawful intent of the person, firm or

14 corporation for whom or which he acts.

16 $\frac{(d)}{(f)}$ Any defendant in an action brought under the

17 provisions of this act may be required to testify under the

18 provisions of the Code of Civil Procedure of this state,

19 and in addition the books and records of any such defendant

20 may be required to be brought into court and introduced, by

21 reference, into evidence; provided, however, that no

22 information so obtained may be used against the defendant

23 as a basis for a misdemeanor prosecution under the

24 provisions of this act.
