1 hunters on land owned by or deeded land leased for 2 agricultural purposes to him the landowner without a guide 3 license, or he the landowner may authorize nonresidents 4 hunting to hunt without a guide on those lands. 5 license must bear the signature of the landowner, lessee, or his agent of the owner on whose private property he is 6 7 hunting—as evidence that permission to hunt has been granted. For purpose of this subsection a "full-time 8 9 employee" is a person whose primary employment 10 responsibilities are connected with the agricultural uses 11 of the land upon which he is guiding. 12 13 23-2-407. (a) No person shall hold himself out as, engage in the business of or act in the capacity of an outfitter or shall engage in the occupation of a professional guide as an independent contractor or as an agent or employee, unless he is licensed as an outfitter or professional guide pursuant to this act or unless he is hired by a landowner as provided in W.S. 23-2-401(c).
