1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming business council; clarifying purposes of business ready community program; modifying 2 3 eligible projects and expenditures under the business ready 4 community program and the community facilities program; 5 clarifying provisions of the community facilities program; 6 and providing for an effective date. 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 9 10 Section **1.** W.S. 9-12-601(a) and (b) and 11 9-12-801(d)(i), by creating a new paragraph (iii) and by renumbering (iii) as (iv), (e) by creating a new paragraph 12 (i) and by renumbering (i) as (ii) and amending and 13 14 renumbering (ii) as (iii) are amended to read: 15 16 9-12-601. 3 (a) It is the purpose of this article to promote 4 economic development at the city, town and county level in 5 order to create additional economic health and a stronger 6 state economy. It is not the purpose of this article that 7 funds be expended in a manner that would result in 8 government offering services that are provided by the 9 private sector.

11 (b) The council shall establish and administer a Wyoming business ready community program as provided by 12 13 this article. Any city, town or county may submit an 14 application to the council for a grant or loan under the program on forms prescribed by and subject to rules 15 promulgated by the council. Grants or loans may be applied 16 17 for by a joint powers board with the approval of all participating agencies to the joint powers agreement. 18 19 Grants and loans may be made by the council for economic or 20 educational development infrastructure projects, including 21 the purchase of land, buildings, facilities, 22 telecommunications infrastructure related to economic development infrastructure projects, rights 23 of way, 24 airports, sewer and water projects, roads, landscaping

1 related to community entrances or places of economic 2 activity, recreational and convention facilities or other 3 infrastructure determined by the council to be consistent 4 with the purposes of this article. In adopting rules and 5 making grants and loans under this article the council shall require all projects to be related to economic or 6 7 educational development infrastructure, which shall not expansion of rehabilitation or 8 include existing 9 infrastructure unless the council determines the 10 rehabilitation or expansion is necessary to meet the 11 purposes of this article. All grants, loans or cooperative 12 agreements made under this article shall be referred by the 13 council to the state loan and investment board for final 14 approval or disapproval. The state loan and investment board may adopt rules as necessary to implement its duties 15 16 under this article.

22 (d) Grants or loans may be recommended by the council and awarded by the state loan and investment board for 23 24 economic development community facilities projects which

1 provide: 2 3 (i) Convention facilities and space for 4 community gatherings and functions; 5 (iii) Landscaping; 6 7 (iii) (iv) Other functions or uses determined by 8 9 the council to be consistent with the purposes of this article. 10 11 12 (e) In adopting rules and recommending grants and loans under this article, the council shall require all 13 projects to be related to economic development or 14 enhancement of quality of life in a community. Projects 15 may consist of: 16 17 (i) Construction of new infrastructure to an 18 19 existing facility, development and rehabilitation of 20 infrastructure serving an existing facility, rehabilitation 21 of an existing facility, and purchase of an existing 22 facility; 23

(i) (ii) The expansion, renovation or remodeling

of existing surplus government facilities; 1

3 (iii) (iii) The purchase of an interest in or cooperative agreements for the expansion, renovation or 4 5 conversion of existing school facilities to the extent the existing facilities exceed statewide school building and 6 7 facility adequacy standards established by the school facilities commission under W.S. 21-15-115. No ownership 8 9 interest to the project or existing facility under a project shall remain with the school district upon 10 expenditure of any funds under this program for any 11 12 project.
