FIFTY-EIGHTH LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING 2006 BUDGET SESSION

AN ACT relating to school capital construction; modifying required periodic maintenance of statewide building condition assessment as specified; and providing for an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Section 1. W.S. 21-15-115(b)(intro) and (c) is amended to read:

21-15-115. Statewide standards for school building and facility adequacy; adequacy assessment.

- In addition to subsection (a) of this section, the commission shall maintain the comprehensive assessment of the adequacy of existing school buildings and facilities and of future space requirements within the state., as established and existing within the department of education on July 1, 2002, and as updated thereafter until the date of transfer to the commission. Maintenance of assessment shall include district reporting of construction and major building and facility repair and replacement activities for the previous year in accordance with guidelines prescribed by rule and regulation of the commission, the results of commission on-site visitations and inspections of buildings and facilities and needs assessment data and verification of building and facility ratings through periodic review. as specified in this act. The assessment shall be designed and maintained to provide timely and uniform statewide data on all of the following:
- (c) The commission shall not less than once every four (4) years, review and evaluate the building and facility adequacy standards established under subsection (a) of this section. and the assessment of building and

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facility adequacy conducted under subsection (b) of this section. Review and evaluation of the standards shall include the identification of local enhancements buildings and facilities during this review and evaluation period, and based upon criteria and procedures developed by the commission, a determination as to whether and how any enhancements should be incorporated into statewide standards. Findings and recommendations pursuant this subsection shall be reported to the committee on school facilities before the next convening date of the legislative session immediately following completion of the review and evaluation, and shall specifically address any need to expand the assessment or to conduct a reassessment of building and facility adequacy.

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Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2006.
