- 1 AN ACT relating to water; providing for water use studies;
- 2 requiring reports; providing appropriations; and providing
- 3 for an effective date.

5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

7 Section 1.

8

- 9 (a) The University of Wyoming shall conduct an
- 10 economic impact study of the cost and benefits associated
- 11 with the opportunity for a private water right holder to
- 12 temporarily or seasonally change the use of the water on a
- 13 case by case basis from a consumptive to nonconsumptive
- 14 use. The study shall include:

15

16 (i) A historic summary of the economic factors,

1 pressures and profits associated with irrigated agriculture

2 in Wyoming, under current water law;

3

4 (ii) Any potential economic and socio-economic

5 advantages and disadvantages from allowing the temporary or

6 seasonal nonconsumptive use of private water rights;

7

8 (iii) Any additional study items as identified

9 by the select water committee.

10

11 (b) The state engineer's office shall conduct a water

12 use study which shall include:

13

14 (i) The existing procedures used by the state

15 engineer's office and the board of control to analyze the

16 hydrologic and water right impacts of temporarily or

17 seasonally changing the type of use, the place of use or

18 the point of diversion of the water right;

19

20 (ii) A discussion of the various sections in

21 water law statutes that allow water right holders to manage

22 water for aquatic systems and other nonconsumptive

23 purposes;

1 (iii) Options to provide greater opportunity for 2 water right holders to manage water for nonconsumptive

3 uses, including temporary changes in type of use, the place

4 of use or temporary transfer of point of diversion that

5 does not require permanent, year-round instream flow rights

pursuant to W.S. 41-3-1001; 6

7

(iv) The hydrologic and operational effects, if 8

9 any, of amending W.S. 41-3-104 or 41-3-110 to allow

10 agricultural users and other water right holders to request

11 a temporary change in the point of diversion or place of

12 use from one (1) location to another;

13

14 (v) The effects of the temporary or seasonal use

of stored water for nonconsumptive uses; 15

16

17 (vi) Changes in Wyoming statutes to enable

participation in federal programs such as the conservation 18

19 reserve enhanced program;

20

21 (vii) Any additional study items as identified

22 by the select water committee.

23

24 (C) The University of Wyoming and the state

- 1 engineer's office may contract with other agencies and any
- 2 consultants as necessary to conduct the studies required by
- 3 this act.

4

- 5 (d) No later than September 1, 2006, the University
- 6 of Wyoming and the state engineer's office shall report the
- 7 results of their respective studies to the joint
- 8 agriculture, public lands and water resources interim
- 9 committee, the joint travel, recreation, wildlife and
- 10 cultural resources interim committee and the select water
- 11 committee.

12

- 13 (e) The select water committee shall identify any
- 14 changes in water statutes necessary to address the results
- 15 from the studies presented by the University of Wyoming and
- 16 the state engineer's office.

17

18 (f) This act shall terminate December 1, 2006.

19

20 Section 2.

- 22 (a) There is appropriated thirty-five thousand
- 23 dollars (\$35,000.00) from the general fund to the
- 24 University of Wyoming to fund the study required pursuant

to subsection 1(a) of this act. 1

2

3 (b) There is appropriated twenty thousand dollars

4 (\$20,000.00) from the general fund to the state engineer's

5 office to fund the study required pursuant to subsection

1(b) of this act. 6

7

Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon 8

9 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

10 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

Constitution. 11
