Storey Gym purchase.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the administration of government;
2 providing for the purchase of the Storey gymnasium
3 building; providing an appropriation; and providing for an
4 effective date.

6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

8 **Section 1.**

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10 (a) There is appropriated not to exceed one million
11 nine hundred thousand dollars (\$1,900,000.00) from the
12 general fund to the department of administration and
13 information. If the conditions of this section are met to
14 the satisfaction of the department, the department shall
15 transfer up to one million three hundred thousand dollars
16 (\$1,300,000.00) of the appropriation to Laramie County

1 School District #1 for the purchase of the Storey Gym and
2 associated grounds in the city of Cheyenne. The department
3 shall not release the funds to the school district unless
4 and until the school district agrees to sell, and the
5 department on behalf of the state agrees to buy, the Storey
6 Gym building and grounds in an agreed upon purchase price
7 not to exceed one million three hundred thousand dollars
8 (\$1,300,000.00);

9
10 (b) The Storey Gym building and grounds are located
11 at 2810 House Avenue, Cheyenne, Wyoming.

13 (c) If the department and Laramie County School
14 District #1 school board cannot agree to purchase terms by
15 December 31, 2006, all sums appropriated in this act shall
16 revert to the general fund.

18 (d) If the property is purchased as provided in
19 subsection (a) of this section, six hundred thousand
20 dollars (\$600,000.00) of the appropriation, or as much
21 thereof as necessary, shall be used by the department for
22 the maintenance of the purchased property during the fiscal
23 biennium commencing July 1, 2006.

1 **Section 2.** This act is effective immediately upon
2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
4 Constitution.
