A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to community colleges; imposing a statewide 2 mill levy for credit to the state general continuously appropriating equal general fund amounts to 3 the community college commission for the regular support 4 and operation of community colleges; excluding a portion of 5 6 the college district levy from the statewide designating college district service area counties and 7 expanding district board membership to include service area 8 county representation; increasing board membership 9 requiring election subdistricts; providing for transition 10 and prescribing expanded board election; and providing for 11 effective dates. 12

21	(c) State funding for the assistance of community
22	colleges shall be appropriated to the community college
23	commission unless otherwise specified by law. Subject to
24	the provisions of this section, funds appropriated for each

- 1 biennium under this subsection and funds appropriated under
- 2 subsection (h) of this section shall be distributed by the
- 3 commission to community colleges in amounts determined by a
- 4 funding allocation model adopted by rule of the commission.
- 5 The commission may maintain a contingency reserve account
- 6 utilizing any revenue derived under W.S. 9-4-601(b)(iv)(A)
- 7 to be distributed as a component of the funding allocation

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11 (vii) At the first meeting of each fiscal year or at any appropriate time, make an estimate of the amount 12 13 of funds required to be raised through a tax levy upon the property lying within the district for community college 14 purposes, and present to the board of county commissioners 15 of each county included within the district, a certified 16 17 estimate of the tax required to raise the appropriate amount. The tax in any one (1) year shall not exceed four 18 (4) mills on the assessed value of the district, excluding 19 any tax approved by the board and imposed under W.S. 20 21 21-18-303(b) and any tax approved by the district electors 22 and imposed under W.S. 21-18-311(f), and one (1) of the four (4) mills of this tax shall be in lieu of the 23 24 statewide tax imposed under W.S. 39-13-104(n). The tax

1 shall be levied and collected in the same manner as other

- 2 county taxes and when collected, the county treasurer shall
- 3 forward the tax revenue to the treasurer of the community
- 4 college district board;

- 16 election subdistricts to provide for representation on the
- 17 district board in accordance with population. Where
- 18 population figures permit, monetary evaluation and
- 19 geographic factors may be considered in determining

- 21 counties under W.S. 21-18-102(a)(xvi), the district board
- 22 shall partition the boundaries of the territory comprising
- 23 the community college district and the service area

Terms of office of board members filled prior to the date continued annexation is defeated shall expire at 23 24 12:00 noon of the first day immediately following the

In those areas of the state within a community college 23

district subject to a mill levy imposed under W.S.

1 21-18-304(a)(vii), one (1) of the imposed four (4) mills 2 levied shall be subtracted from the tax assessed and levied 3 under this subsection for that year. Except as otherwise specified in this subsection, the tax authorized in this 4 5 subsection shall be in addition to any and all other taxes authorized by law. 6 7 39-13-111. Distribution. 8 9 The following shall apply to the distribution of 10 11 tax collections: 12 13 (iv) The county treasurer shall transfer any money collected from the tax imposed by W.S. 39-13-104(n) 14 to the state treasurer for deposit into the state general 15 fund. 16 17 18 Section 2. 19 Not later than thirty (30) days following the 20 21 effective date of this act, the board of trustees of each community college district shall by resolution partition 22 the territory of the district into election subdistricts 23 for representation on the expanded nine (9) member board, 24

1 as increased under W.S. 21-18-308(a), as amended under 2 Section 1 of this act. Election subdistricts shall be 3 established based upon population and other specified under W.S. 21-18-308(b), as amended under Section 4 5 1 of this act. If the community college district is assigned counties 6 service area under W.S. 21-18-102(a)(xvi), as amended under Section 1 of this act, 7 the community college district board shall combine the 8 9 territory of the district and its designated service area counties into election subdistricts and the board shall 10 designate the number of board members to be elected from 11 each subdistrict in accordance with the population of the 12 combined territory of the district and its service area 13 14 counties, subject to the simple majority district representation requirement imposed under W.S. 21-18-308(b), 15 as amended by Section 1 of this act. 16

(b) An election of members to the expanded board of trustees of a community college district pursuant to subsection (a) of this section shall be held at the 2008 general election date specified under W.S. 22-2-104(a). Nominations to the expanded board of trustees shall be submitted on forms provided by the county clerk of the county comprising the appropriate election subdistrict and

1 the election shall be otherwise conducted as provided by

2 law. Terms of office of board members filled prior to the

3 effective date of this act shall expire upon commencement

4 of the certification of the election of members to the

5 expanded board. Initial terms of trustees to be elected to

6 the expanded board shall begin upon certification of the

7 election results and shall be for not less than two (2) or

8 not less than four (4) years as determined by the board as

9 necessary to coincide with the terms of office prescribed

10 under W.S. 22-22-102. Not more than five (5) initial

11 members shall be elected for terms of not less than four

12 (4) years and the board shall designate and report to the

13 appropriate county clerk the length of term for each

14 trustee office to be filled in the election. Thereafter,

15 all terms shall be for four (4) years in accordance with

16 W.S. 22-22-102.
