Mental health and substance abuse appropriations.

Sponsored by: Select Committee on Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services

A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to mental health and substance abuse
- 2 appropriations; providing appropriations as specified;
- 3 specifying conditions; continuing a study of mental health
- 4 and substance abuse services delivery systems; and
- 5 providing for effective dates.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8

- 9 Section 1. Strategic alcohol prevention framework
- 10 grants.

11

- 12 (a) In addition to any federal funding provided under
- 13 the strategic prevention framework state incentive grant
- 14 (SPF/SIG) program, there is appropriated six hundred
- 15 thousand dollars (\$600,000.00) from the general fund to the
- 16 department of health for the biennium beginning July 1,

1 2008 and ending June 30, 2010. The funds appropriated under

2 this section shall be used by counties receiving grants to:

3

4 (i) Prevent the onset and reduce the progression

5 of substance abuse, including underage drinking;

6

7 (ii) Reduce substance abuse related problems in

8 communities; and

9

10 (iii) Build prevention capacities and

11 infrastructure at community levels.

12

13 (b) The funds appropriated under this section shall

14 be distributed by the mental health and substance abuse

15 services division of the department of health to a single

16 applicant selected from within each of the counties and the

17 Wind River Indian Reservation, based upon recommendations

18 of the state epidemiological workgroup.

19

20 (c) Only one (1) application from each county and the

21 Wind River Indian Reservation shall be accepted. If more

22 than one (1) application is received from within a county

23 or the Wind River Indian Reservation, all applications from

24 that county or the Wind River Indian Reservation shall be

2

1 returned to the respective applicants with instructions to

2 collaborate and submit a single application. Each recipient

of funds under subsection (b) of this section shall receive 3

a grant not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) 4

5 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2008 and ending June 30,

2010 to address the goals specified under subsection (a) of 6

7 this section.

Section 2. Substance abuse residential treatment for

10 women and women with children.

11

- 12 There is appropriated one million six hundred ninety-three thousand six hundred dollars (\$1,693,600.00), 13 14 or as much thereof as necessary, from the general fund to
- 15 the department of health for the biennium beginning July 1,

2008 and ending June 30, 2010. The funds appropriated 16

17 under this section shall be used to allow the mental health

and substance abuse services division of the department of 18

19 health to fund not more than sixteen (16) beds and the

20 reasonable start up costs related to those beds in the

21 southeast region of the state for women who need substance

3

22 abuse treatment services and their children.

1	(b) Services authorized under this section may
2	include arranging for or providing:
3	
4	(i) Child care for children of eligible women
5	while the women are receiving substance abuse treatment;
6	
7	(ii) Case management services;
8	
9	(iii) Transportation;
10	
11	(iv) Education;
12	
13	(v) Primary health care; and
14	
15	(vi) Therapeutic interventions.

17	Section 3. Crisis stabilization services.
18	
19	(a) There is appropriated five million one hundred
20	seventy-seven thousand four hundred thirty dollars
21	(\$5,177,430.00), or as much thereof as necessary, from the
22	general fund to the department of health for the biennium
23	beginning July 1, 2008 and ending June 30, 2010. The funds
24	appropriated under this section shall only be used to

1 provide crisis stabilization services in four (4) regions 2 of the state as specified in subsection (b) of this 3 section. The services authorized under this section shall 4 include community based, short-term intervention for adults 5 who are experiencing an acute mental health crisis and are in need of twenty-four (24) hour intensive mental health 6 treatment and stabilization, and may include persons with 7 co-occurring disorders. Community mental health centers 8 9 providing crisis stabilization services shall ensure that 10 the services can be provided in a setting staffed twenty-11 four (24) hours per day and seven (7) days per week, with the availability of medical services as necessary. Mobile 12 13 teams and in-home services may also be provided, based on 14 individual client needs. To maximize existing resources, community mental health centers in a region specified in 15 16 subsection (b) of this section may collaborate in 17 developing and providing the necessary services.

19 (b) The department of health, mental health and 20 substance abuse services division, may enter into contracts 21 for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 2008 and ending 22 June 30, 2010 with community mental health centers that 23 agree to provide crisis stabilization services in regions 24 designated as follows:

(i) In the Basin region of the state, the division may contract for not more than six (6) crisis stabilization beds at a cost not to exceed one million three hundred fifty-six thousand four hundred fourteen dollars (\$1,356,414.00);

7

8 (ii) In the central region of the state, the 9 division may contract for not more than six (6) crisis 10 stabilization beds at a cost not to exceed one million 11 thirteen thousand seven hundred two dollars 12 (\$1,013,702.00);

13

(iii) In the northeast region of the state, the division may contract for not more than six (6) crisis stabilization beds at a cost not to exceed one million three hundred fifty-six thousand four hundred fourteen dollars (\$1,356,414.00);

20 (iv) In the southwest region of the state, the 21 division may contract for not more than eight (8) crisis 22 stabilization beds at a cost not to exceed one million four 23 hundred fifty thousand nine hundred dollars 24 (\$1,450,900.00).

Section 4. Substance abuse training.

3

- 4 There is appropriated forty thousand dollars (\$40,000.00),
- 5 or as much thereof as necessary, from the general fund to
- 6 the department of health for the biennium beginning July 1,
- 7 2008 and ending June 30, 2010. This appropriation shall be
- 8 included in the agency's standard budget request for the
- 9 biennium beginning July 1, 2010. The funds appropriated
- 10 under this section shall only be used to provide
- 11 specialized training to judges, attorneys and mental
- 12 health, substance abuse and other providers who work with
- 13 persons who may need mental health or alcohol or substance
- 14 abuse treatment services.

15

- 16 Section 5. Select committee on mental health and
- 17 substance abuse services.

18

- 19 There is appropriated sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000.00)
- 20 from the general fund to the legislative service office for
- 21 the period beginning July 1, 2008 and ending December 31,
- 22 2009. The funds appropriated under this section shall be
- 23 expended as necessary to pay the costs and expenses of the
- 24 select committee on mental health and substance abuse

1 services to enable the committee to continue its study of

2 issues during the 2008 and 2009 legislative interims and to

3 propose legislation for a more cost effective and

4 accessible delivery system of services for persons in need

5 of mental health or alcohol or substance abuse treatment.

13 There is appropriated two million one 14 hundred thirty-one thousand three hundred seventeen dollars (\$2,131,317.00), or as much 15 thereof as is necessary, from the general fund to 16 17 department of health, substance division, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 18 2007 and ending June 30, 2008. 19 The funds 20 appropriated under this subsection shall only be 21 used to fund reasonable start up costs and 22 treatment services to increase the capacity of community substance abuse treatment centers to 23 24 provide residential treatment. Funds
