1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; modifying penalties for 2 owners of dogs injuring or threatening big game animals; modifying elements of the offense; and providing for an 3 4 effective date. 5 6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 7 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-3-109(c) is amended to read: 9 10 23-3-109. Use of dogs; dogs injuring big or trophy game animals may be killed; citation of owners of dogs 11 12 harassing game animals; penalties.

1	(c) A peace officer may arrest or issue a summons to
2	$\underline{T}$ he owner of any dog injuring or threatening a big game
3	animal with immediate injury where the vicious character of
4	the dog is manifest to the officer is guilty of a low
5	misdemeanor punishable as provided in W.S. 23-6-202(a)(v),
6	unless the dog was attempting to protect livestock. $\frac{1}{2}$
7	first conviction under this subsection is punishable by a
8	fine imposed for a low misdemeanor punishable as provided
9	in W.S. 23 6 202(a)(v). A second and each subsequent
10	conviction under this subsection is punishable by a fine
11	and imprisonment imposed for a low misdemeanor punishable
12	as provided in W.S. 23 6 202(a)(v).

Staff note: There is some question whether creating a 14 15 personal crime (as opposed to allowing the killing of the animal to protect wildlife) based solely on the subjective 16 opinion of the officer that the animal is vicious is 17 18 unconstitutionally vague. It might be better to follow the 19 **Colorado statute which says:** "it is unlawful for any person to knowingly 20 or negligently allow or direct a dog which he owns or which is under his control to 21 harass wildlife, whether or not the wildlife is actually injured by such dog. Any 22 person who violates this subsection (2) is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon 23 conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of two hundred dollars.".
