A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to art in public buildings; providing for 2 placement of art in renovations of public buildings; 3 providing for placement of art in school buildings; removing limitation on expenditures for art in public 4 5 buildings; providing for maintenance of all art in public 6 buildings; requiring school facilities commission and 7 community colleges using state funding to incorporate works 8 of art for public display in capital construction projects; 9 and providing for an effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

1 **Section 1.** W.S. 16-6-801(a)(i), (iv) and by creating 2 a new paragraph (ix), 16-6-802(a) and (b), 21-15-119(a) by 3 creating a new paragraph (iv) and 21-18-205(g) are amended to read: 4 5 16-6-801. Definitions. 6 7 (a) As used in this article: 8 9 10 (i) "Agency" means any state office, department, 11 board, commission, university, school district or 12 institution and any community college district to which 13 funds have been appropriated, bonded or otherwise provided 14 by the state for the design and original construction or 15 major renovation of any new building; 16 17 (iv) "Building" means any permanent structure 18 and any appurtenant structure intended to function as an 19 office, courtroom, hearing or meeting room or other space 20 for carrying on the operation of any agency and any auditorium, meeting room, classroom or other educational 21 22 facility, library or museum space, or information center

for use by the public, excluding utility lines, water

- 1 projects, fish ponds, school buildings, city buildings,
- 2 county buildings, public restrooms at state parks, separate
- 3 structures which are not part of a larger construction
- 4 project intended solely as storage, warehouse or
- 5 maintenance and repair facilities;

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- 7 (ix) "Major renovation" means the renovation of
- 8 any building for which the total cost is one hundred
- 9 thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) or more.

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- 11 16-6-802. Construction of new public buildings; state
- 12 funds.

- 14 (a) The original construction or major renovation of
- 15 any new building shall include works of art for public
- 16 display, which shall be included by the agency in
- 17 determining total construction costs of the building at an
- 18 amount equal to one percent (1%) of total costs but not to
- 19 exceed one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) on any
- 20 one (1) project, or in the case of school district or
- 21 community college buildings, an amount equal to one percent
- 22 (1%) of the total state funded portion of the costs on any
- 23 one (1) project. Any new construction project for which

1 the total cost is less than one hundred thousand dollars

2 (\$100,000.00) is exempt from this subsection.

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Except as provided in subsection (c) of this 4 (b) 5 transferring or authorizing the section, prior to 6 expenditure of any state funds for the 7 construction or major renovation of any new building, the state auditor shall transfer to the state treasurer an 8 amount equal to the amount specified under subsection (a) 9 of this section for works of art. Upon receipt, the state 10 11 treasurer shall deposit the amount transferred into a 12 separate account, together with any grants, gifts or other 13 funds received or appropriated by the state for the sole 14 purpose of acquiring works of art for placement in 15 buildings. Amounts deposited within the separate account shall be expended by the department for the acquisition of 16 works of art by purchase, lease, commission or otherwise, 17 18 the maintenance of any works of art placed in public pursuant to this article and 19 administration of this article. 20

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22 <u>(c) Prior to transferring or authorizing the</u>
23 expenditure of any state funds for the original

1 construction or major renovation of any school district or 2 community college district building, the state auditor 3 shall transfer to the state treasurer an amount equal to the amount specified under subsection (a) of this section 4 5 for works of art. Upon receipt, the state treasurer shall 6 deposit the amount transferred into a separate account, 7 together with any grants, gifts or other funds received or appropriated by the state for the sole purpose of acquiring 8 9 works of art for placement in school district or community 10 college district buildings. Amounts deposited within the 11 separate account under this subsection shall be expended by 12 the department for the acquisition of works of art by 13 purchase, lease, commission or otherwise, the maintenance 14 of any works of art placed in school district or community college district buildings and for the administration of 15 16 this article.

1 (b) The acquisition of works of art from funds within

2 the separate account accounts established under W.S. 16-6-

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5 (g) Notwithstanding any other provision of this

6 article, works of art selected pursuant to this section for

7 placement in school district or community college district

8 buildings shall not be placed until the works of art are

9 approved by the local school district board or the

10 community college district board in which the building is

11 located.

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13 21-15-119. Commission budget and funding

14 recommendations.

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16 (a) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1012, the commission

17 shall annually, not later than November 1, and after review

18 by and in conjunction with the select committee on school

19 facilities, prepare and submit a recommended budget for

20 projects and school capital construction financing to the

21 governor, through the budget division of the department of

22 administration and information. The recommended budget

23 submitted by the commission shall include:

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(iv) An amount for purchase of works of art for 2 3 public display as required under W.S. 16-6-801 through 16-6-805, which amount is in addition to and not part of any 4 5 facility remedy as defined under W.S. 21-15-111(a)(v) or 6 any major building and facility repair and replacement 7 project defined under W.S. 21-15-109(a)(iii), and which amount shall not be funded from the capital construction 8 9 account.

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21-18-205. Appropriation and distribution of state funds; restrictions; budget authority.

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(g) No state funds shall be used for the maintaining, operating or equipping of any capital construction project in excess of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) which was not approved by the commission and authorized by the legislature. All state funds authorized for capital construction projects shall be subject to the provisions of W.S. 16-6-801 through 16-6-805.
