Ownership of wildlife; of purpose provisions. 8 9 10 For the purpose of this act, all wildlife in Wyoming is the 11 property of the state. It is the purpose of this act and 12 the policy of the state to provide an adequate and flexible 13 system for control, propagation, management, protection and 14 regulation of all Wyoming wildlife. There shall be no private ownership of live animals classified in this act as 15 16 big or trophy game animals or of any wolf or wolf hybrid. 17 18 23-1-302. Powers and duties. 19 (a) The commission is directed and empowered: 20 21 22 (xxix) After the date gray wolves 23 from the list of experimental nonessential population,

The commission shall manage and regulate 8 9 the taking of gray wolves in a manner consistent with that 10 of other trophy game and in a manner which facilitates the 11 removal of the gray wolf from the list of experimental 12 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened 13 species in Wyoming and prevents any such future listing of 14 the gray wolf. 15 16 23-2-101. 10 (e) When hunting antelope, bighorn sheep, black bear, 11 deer, gray wolf, mountain goat or mountain lion the longbow 12 hunter must be equipped with a longbow of not less than 13 forty (40) pounds draw weight or possessing the ability to 14 cast a hunting arrow of four hundred (400) grain weight at least one hundred sixty (160) yards. When hunting elk, 15 16 grizzly bear or moose, the longbow hunter must be equipped with a longbow of not less than fifty (50) pounds draw 17 18 weight or possessing the ability to cast a hunting arrow of five hundred (500) grain weight at least one hundred sixty 19 20 (160) yards. The crossbow hunter must be equipped with a crossbow of not less than ninety (90) pounds draw weight 21 which has a minimum draw length of fourteen (14) inches 22 23 (from front of bow to back of string in the cocked

position) and a positive safety mechanism. Crossbow bolts 1 2 must be at least sixteen (16) inches long. The broadhead of arrows or bolts shall be of sharp steel with a minimum 3 cutting width of one (1) inch. The provisions of this 4 subsection relating to the hunting of antelope, bighorn 5 6 sheep, black bear, deer, mountain goat and mountain lion 7 shall also apply to the hunting of the gray wolf as a trophy game animal from and after the date gray wolves are 8 removed from the list of experimental nonessential 9 population, endangered species or threatened species in 10 11 Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23 1 108.

(d) All traps and snares used for furbearing or predatory animals shall be permanently marked or tagged and address of the the name owner the identification number assigned to the owner by the department. Any identification number attached to a trap or snare pursuant to this subsection is solely for the use of the department or appropriate law enforcement officers

and is not a public record for purposes of W.S. 16-4-201 1 2 through 16-4-205. No trap or snare shall be set for 3 furbearing or predatory animals within thirty (30) feet of any exposed bait or carcass over five (5) pounds in weight. 4 5 As used in this subsection, "exposed bait or carcass" means the meat or viscera of any part of a mammal, bird or fish, 6 7 excluding dried bones. In addition, all snares used for taking furbearing or predatory animals shall be equipped 8 9 with a break-away locking device that is designed to 10 release at two hundred ninety-five (295) pounds of pressure 11 or less and a snare loop not to exceed twelve (12) inches 12 in diameter measured side to side. Unless otherwise 13 specified in this section, all traps, excluding snares set 14 for furbearing animals and predatory animals and quick kill defined by commission rule 15 body grip traps as regulation, shall be checked by the owner at least once 16 17 during each seventy-two (72) hour period from the time the 18 traps were set. Quick kill body grip traps shall be 19 checked by the owner not less than once each seven (7) day period from the time the traps were set. All wildlife 20 21 caught in any trap or snare shall upon discovery, be 22 removed immediately by the owner. Violation of this 23 subsection constitutes a low misdemeanor punishable as

(a) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, any person who takes any big or trophy game animal or gray wolf where classified as a trophy game animal without the proper license or authority is guilty of a high misdemeanor punishable as provided in W.S. 23-6-202(a)(ii). The taking of each animal is a separate offense.

1 Any person who knowingly takes any antlered elk, (d) 2 antlered deer, antlered moose, horned antelope, bighorn sheep, mountain goat, mountain lion, gray wolf, grizzly 3 bear or black bear without the proper license or during a 4 5 closed season except as otherwise permitted by this act is quilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less 6 7 than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) nor more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00), imprisonment for not more 8 9 than one (1) year, or both. 10 11 23-3-115. Taking certain animals for damaging 12 property. 13 14 (d) Any gray wolf in the act of attacking any 15

livestock or dog may be immediately taken and killed by the owner of the livestock or dog or an employee of the owner 16 or lessee of the livestock or dog. The owner, employee or 17 18 lessee shall immediately notify the nearest game warden of 19 the killing of a gray wolf pursuant to this subsection. 20 For purposes of this subsection the "act of attacking" is defined as actual biting, wounding, grasping or killing of 21 22 livestock or a dog, or chasing, molesting or harassing by a 23 wolf that would indicate to a reasonable person that

- 1 actual, biting, wounding, grasping or killing of livestock
- 2 or a dog is likely to occur at any moment.
