## A BILL

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- 6 (a) The legislature finds that Wyoming and its people
  7 possess a unique cultural heritage. The legislature
  8 further finds that there is a need to preserve, promote and
  9 enhance that unique cultural heritage for the citizens of
- 10 the state and the nation and for future generations to
- 11 understand and appreciate the heritage that makes Wyoming
- 12 unique among the United States.

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10 There is appropriated one million four Section 2. 11 hundred thirty thousand dollars (\$1,430,000.00) from the 12 general fund to the department of state parks and cultural 13 resources. This appropriation shall be for the period 14 beginning with the effective date of this act and ending 15 June 30, 2010. This appropriation shall only be expended 16 for the purpose of funding grants under and administering 17 the cultural and heritage area program. Notwithstanding 9-18 2-1008, 9-2-1012(e) and 9-4-207, these funds which are unexpended, unobligated or unencumbered as of June 30, 2010 19 shall not revert to the general fund but shall be retained 20 21 by the department for the purposes specified in this This appropriation shall not be included in the 22 section. 23 department's 2011-2012 standard biennial budget request.
