1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; expanding area where 2 wolves are designated as trophy game animals; providing for management of fifteen breeding pairs of wolves in the 3 4 state; providing for a memorandum of understanding with the national park service; and providing for an effective date. 5 6 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 9 Section **1.** W.S. 11-6-302(a)(x)(B)(I), 23-1-101(a)(xii)(B)(I), 23-1-302(a) by creating a new 10 paragraph (xxx), 23-1-304(a) and (n) are amended to read: 11 12 13 11-6-302. Definitions. 14

1 (a) As used in this article: 2 3 "Trophy game animal" means: (X) 4 5 (B) From and after the date gray wolves are 6 removed from the list of experimental nonessential 7 population, endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108: 8 9 (I) "Trophy game animal" shall include 10 11 any gray wolf within those tracts of land within the 12 following described area, subject to modification as 13 authorized in this subdivision: northwest Wyoming beginning 14 at the east boundary of the Shoshone National Forest and 15 the Wyoming Montana state line; southerly along said forest 16 boundary to the common boundary between the Shoshone 17 National Forest and the Wind River Indian Reservation; 18 westerly and then southeasterly along the Shoshone National 19 Forest boundary to the Union Pass Road (USFS Road 263); southerly along said road until it intersects the north 20 boundary of the Upper Green River Cattle Association's 21 grazing allotment on forest service lands; following the 22 23 eastern boundary of said allotment southerly and westerly

1	to the point it intersects the Bridger Teton National
2	Forest boundary; westerly along said forest boundary to
3	U.S. Highway 189 191; northwesterly along said highway to
4	U.S. Highway 26 89 191 at Hoback Junction; northerly along
5	said highway to Wyoming Highway 22; westerly along said
6	highway to the Wyoming Idaho state line; north along said
7	state line to the Wyoming Montana state line; north and
8	then east along said state line to the east boundary of the
9	Shoshone National Forest junction of Wyoming Highway 120
10	and the Wyoming-Montana state line; southerly along Wyoming
11	Highway 120 to the Greybull River; southwesterly up said
12	river to the Wood River; southwesterly up said river to the
13	Shoshone National Forest boundary; southerly along said
14	boundary to the Wind River Indian Reservation boundary;
15	westerly, then southerly along said boundary to the
16	Continental Divide; southeasterly along said divide to the
17	Middle Fork of Boulder Creek; westerly down said creek to
18	Boulder Creek; westerly down said creek to the Bridger-
19	Teton National Forest boundary; northwesterly along said
20	boundary to its intersection with U.S. Highway 189-191;
21	northwesterly along said highway to the intersection with
22	U.S. Highway 26-89-191; northerly along said highway to
23	Wyoming Highway 22 in the town of Jackson; westerly along

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1	said highway to the Wyoming-Idaho state line; north along
2	said state line to the Wyoming-Montana state line; north,
3	then east along said state line to Wyoming Highway 120.
4	This described area may be diminished by rule of the game
5	and fish commission if the game and fish commission
6	determines the diminution does not impede the delisting of
7	gray wolves and will facilitate Wyoming's management of
8	wolves; and

10	23-1-101. Definitions of wildlife.
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12	(a) As used in this act:

14	(xii) "Trophy game animal" means:

16	(B) From and after the date gray wolves are
17	removed from the list of experimental nonessential
18	population, endangered species or threatened species in
19	Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108:
20	
21	(I) "Trophy game animal" shall include
22	any gray wolf within those tracts of land within the
23	following described area, subject to modification as

authorized in this subdivision: northwest Wyoming beginning 1 2 at the east boundary of the Shoshone National Forest and the Wyoming Montana state line; southerly along said forest 3 boundary to the common boundary between the Shoshone 4 National Forest and the Wind River Indian Reservation; 5 6 westerly and then southeasterly along the Shoshone National 7 Forest boundary to the Union Pass Road (USFS Road 263); southerly along said road until it intersects the north 8 9 boundary of the Upper Green River Cattle Association's 10 grazing allotment on forest service lands; following the 11 eastern boundary of said allotment southerly and westerly 12 to the point it intersects the Bridger Teton National 13 Forest boundary; westerly along said forest boundary to 14 U.S. Highway 189 191; northwesterly along said highway to 15 U.S. Highway 26 89 191 at Hoback Junction; northerly along said highway to Wyoming Highway 22; westerly along said 16 17 highway to the Wyoming Idaho state line; north along said 18 state line to the Wyoming Montana state line; north and 19 then east along said state line to the east boundary of the 20 Shoshone National Forest junction of Wyoming Highway 120 21 and the Wyoming-Montana state line; southerly along Wyoming 22 Highway 120 to the Greybull River; southwesterly up said 23 river to the Wood River; southwesterly up said river to the

1	Shoshone National Forest boundary; southerly along said
2	boundary to the Wind River Indian Reservation boundary;
3	westerly, then southerly along said boundary to the
4	Continental Divide; southeasterly along said divide to the
5	Middle Fork of Boulder Creek; westerly down said creek to
6	Boulder Creek; westerly down said creek to the Bridger-
7	Teton National Forest boundary; northwesterly along said
8	boundary to its intersection with U.S. Highway 189-191;
9	northwesterly along said highway to the intersection with
10	U.S. Highway 26-89-191; northerly along said highway to
11	Wyoming Highway 22 in the town of Jackson; westerly along
12	said highway to the Wyoming-Idaho state line; north along
13	said state line to the Wyoming-Montana state line; north,
14	then east along said state line to Wyoming Highway 120.
15	This described area may be diminished by rule of the
16	commission if the commission determines the diminution does
17	not impede the delisting of gray wolves and will facilitate
18	Wyoming's management of wolves; and

20	23-1-302. Powers and duties.
21	
22	(a) The commission is directed and empowered:
23	

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1	(xxx) To enter into memoranda of agreement with
2	the states of Idaho and Montana to cooperate in the
3	capture, transport, exchange and release of gray wolves
4	into and out of those areas of the state where the gray
5	wolf is not listed as a predator as the commission deems
6	necessary to assure genetic interchange among the
7	populations of gray wolves within the three (3) states.
8	
9	23-1-304. Classification of gray wolves.
10	
11	(a) The commission shall by rule and regulation
12	establish areas within the state where gray wolves are
13	classified as trophy game animals and set seasons and bag
14	limits within those areas. The areas designated, seasons
15	and bag limits shall be set annually in a manner the
16	commission determines, through rule and regulation, only as
17	necessary to reasonably ensure:
18	
19	(i) At least seven (7) breeding pairs of gray
20	wolves are located in this state and primarily outside of
21	Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park and
22	John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway at the end of the
23	current calendar year <mark>; and</mark>

2	(ii) If the national park service has entered
3	into a memorandum of understanding with the commission
4	regarding the management of gray wolves within Yellowstone
5	National Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D.
6	Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway, at least fifteen (15)
7	breeding pairs of gray wolves are located within the state.
8	
9	(n) The commission shall promulgate rules and
10	regulations providing for issuance of annual permits to
11	landowners or livestock owners for removing wolves which
12	are harassing, injuring, maiming or killing livestock or
13	other domesticated animals and for wolves occupying
14	geographic areas where chronic wolf predation occurs. The
15	permits shall be issued as long as there are seven (7)
16	breeding pairs within the state and outside of Yellowstone
17	National Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D.
18	Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway the management objectives
19	described in subsection (a) of this section are met. The
20	rules shall provide for suspending or cancelling permits if
21	further lethal control could cause relisting of wolves
22	under the endangered species act.

Section 2. W.S. 11-6-302(b), 23-1-101(b) and 2007
 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 168, Section 1 are repealed.
 3

4 Section 3. The legislature declares that the
5 contingencies provided in 2007 Wyoming Session Laws,
6 Chapter 168 and W.S. 23-1-109 have occurred and that
7 legislation is effective as amended by this act.

9 Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon 10 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 11 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 12 Constitution.
