6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-19-407 is amended to read:

10 11-19-407. Brucellosis management program.

- 12 (a) The livestock board shall develop a brucellosis
- 13 testing management program which may be conducted with the
- 14 help of veterinary practitioners and livestock auction
- 15 markets. This program shall provide for the testing,
- 16 spaying of heifers and other management of livestock for

1 brucellosis pursuant to risk assessments and herd plans

2 <u>within the designated surveillance area</u> only to the extent

3 that may be reasonably necessary to maintain or to regain

4 the brucellosis-free status of the state of Wyoming.

5

compensation for brucellosis surveillance 6 (b) testing or spaying shall be paid at not less than three 7 dollars and fifty cents (\$3.50) per head and not more than 8 9 eight dollars (\$8.00) per head of cattle actually tested or 10 Compensation for brucellosis testing or spaying spayed. may include the purchase of brucellosis testing equipment, 11 supplies and postage. 12

Payments under subsection (b) of this section 14 shall be made monthly directly to accredited veterinarians 15 who perform brucellosis testing, spaying and surveillance 16 17 planning or to livestock auction markets that use their facilities and veterinarians to conduct brucellosis testing 18 as mandated by rule or spaying to comply with brucellosis 19 20 rules of the Wyoming livestock board or the United States 21 department of agriculture animal plant and 22 inspection service. The payment shall be made upon submission to the Wyoming livestock board of a notarized 23 24 invoice indicating the number of head tested or spayed, the

ownership of the animals tested or spayed and the testing 1 2 location of the testing or spaying. 3 In addition to payments under subsection (b) of 4 5 this section, payments may be made for fencing, feed and other preventive activities undertaken for the purpose of 6 7 keeping cattle separated from elk in areas of high brucellosis prevalence in elk, provided that such payments 8 9 shall be made only when: 10 11 (i) The activity is undertaken to comply with a quarantine order of the Wyoming state veterinarian; or 12 13 14 (ii) The activity is pursuant to the terms of a livestock herd plan that has been entered into with the 15 16 Wyoming state veterinarian. 17 (e) The payment under subsection (d) of this section 18 19 shall be made upon completion of the fence, purchase of the 20 feed or upon completion of other preventive activity and 21 upon submission to the Wyoming livestock board of a notarized invoice for materials or labor, including the 22

location and length of the fence, the amount of feed and a

description of the preventative activity.

2 (f) The Wyoming livestock board may promulgate rules 3 it deems necessary for the implementation of this section. 4

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2009. 5
