1 (a) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this 2 contrary, prior article to the to considering a 3 recommendation or petition to adopt, amend or repeal rules, 4 regulations, standards or permitting systems related to or 5 that may affect engineered containment systems at municipal landfills, the board and council shall give notice and 6 receive public comment on a risk assessment related to the 7 recommendation or petition. If the council determines that 8 9 the risk assessment does not accurately or adequately identify and evaluate all the data and criteria required 10 11 under W.S. 35-11-524(b), then prior to considering the recommended or requested rules, regulations, standards or 12 13 permitting systems, the council shall direct the department to collect data and perform the evaluations that the 14 council identifies as incomplete or inconsistent with the 15 requirements of W.S. 35-11-524(b). 16

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(b) The council shall give notice, receive public comment, and determine that the revised risk assessment is accurate and adequate under W.S. 35-11-524(b) prior to proceeding with consideration of the recommendation or petition to adopt, amend or repeal rules, regulations, standards or permitting systems related to or that may

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affect engineered containment systems at municipal
 landfills.

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4 (c) The council shall make risk management decisions 5 taking into consideration a risk assessment prepared by the 6 department when adopting, amending or repealing rules, 7 regulations, standards or permitting systems related to or 8 that may affect engineered containment systems at municipal 9 landfills.

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(d) A decision by the council that the risk assessment is accurate and adequate under W.S. 35-11-524(b) shall be a final decision of the agency pursuant to the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act.

16	imposed by law, the director of the department shall:

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18	(a) When the department has, by rule or regulation,
19	required a permit to be obtained it is the duty of the
20	director to issue such permits upon proof by the applicant
21	that the procedures of this act and the rules and
22	regulations promulgated hereunder have been complied with.
23	In granting permits, the director shall, upon the request
24	of the applicant for a permit related to engineered

1	containment systems at municipal landfills, prepare a risk
2	assessment. In granting permits related to engineered
3	containment systems at municipal landfills, the director
4	shall make risk management decisions and for any permit,
5	may impose such conditions as may be necessary to
6	accomplish the purpose of this act which are not
7	inconsistent with the existing rules, regulations and
8	standards. An administrator shall not issue permits and may
9	issue a license under this act only as specifically
10	authorized in this act.
