## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to water; providing for temporary water
- 2 rights as specified; providing procedures; imposing a fee;
- 3 requiring a study and reports as specified; providing
- 4 definitions; providing a repealer date; providing a
- 5 statement of policy; and providing for an effective date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 41-3-116 and 41-3-117 are created to
- 10 read:

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- 12 41-3-116. Temporary water acquisition study; right to
- 13 acquire temporary water rights for trout fishery purposes;
- 14 application; restrictions; fee; sunset provision.

1 (a) The state engineer's office, in consultation with 2 the Wyoming game and fish department and the applicant, 3 shall conduct and coordinate a study that provides the 4 following data for each stream reach and each pilot 5 temporary change application approved under subsection (b) of this section: 6 7 (i) The length of the stream reach and how it 8 9 was determined; 10 11 (ii) An assessment of the expected trout fishery benefits during the term of the temporary change period; 12 13 (iii) Legal standards and technical data used to 14 determine and substantiate the amount of water available 15 16 for stream flows through temporary change of existing 17 rights; 18 19 (iv) Conditions, if necessary, to ensure that 20 the temporary change for trout fishery purposes does not 21 injure other appropriators; and 22 23 (v) Methods and technical means used to monitor

use of water under each temporary change.

2	(b) The study described in subsection (a) of this
3	section is intended to assess and support an application by
4	which any person shall have the right to acquire the right
5	to the use of water which may be embraced in any
6	adjudicated water right, or any portion thereof, for a
7	period not to exceed ten (10) years for trout fishery
8	purposes. For applications granted after July 1, 2014, the
9	term of the temporary change for trout fishery purposes
10	shall not exceed five (5) years or July 1, 2019, whichever
11	comes first. The right to surplus or excess direct flow
12	shall not be included in the amount of water temporarily
13	changed to a trout fishery purpose. The priority of the
14	temporary water right for trout fishery purposes pursuant
15	to this section is the same as the priority of the water
16	right approved for change. Any temporary transfer under
17	this section shall be allowed only if no other appropriator
18	is injured thereby. When evaluating injury, the state
19	engineer's office may consider mitigating potential impacts
20	to water right holders who may have historically benefited
21	from seasonal water use interruptions of the downstream
22	senior appropriator filing a temporary water right change
23	for trout fishery purposes. The following shall apply:

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1 (i) Before any right to such use shall become 2 operative, an application shall be made in writing by the 3 holder of the water right on a form provided or designated 4 by the state engineer, with a copy of any conveyance or 5 agreement provided, and shall be filed in the office of the state engineer for his review and approval. If approved by 6 the state engineer, an order authorizing such use and 7 designating the method, amount, place and period of use may 8 9 be entered. The application shall include information on 10 the length and location of the stream reach in which the 11 stream flow is to be maintained or enhanced;

12

13 (ii) The applicant for a temporary change for 14 trout fishery purposes shall publish a notice of 15 application in a newspaper of general circulation in the area near the proposed stream segment within thirty (30) 16 17 days of the application being filed. If a hearing is required pursuant to paragraph (iii) of this subsection, 18 19 additional notice of the hearing shall be published once each week for at least two (2) consecutive weeks prior to 20 21 the hearing which notice shall briefly describe the 22 application;

1 (iii) Prior to granting or denying the

2 application, the state engineer may hold a public hearing.

3 The state engineer may require the applicant to pay for the

4 costs of the hearing;

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(iv) No loss, abandonment or impairment of water 6 rights shall occur or attach as a result of the temporary 7 change of use of water for trout fishery purposes, except 8 9 as provided by the conveyance or agreement and order of the 10 state engineer. Upon termination of the temporary use for 11 trout fishery purposes as stated in the order, any affected right to the use of water shall automatically be reinvested 12 13 with all the rights, privileges and uses, and purposes

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(v) As used in this section, "trout fishery
purposes" means the in-channel temporary use achieved by
either leaving the direct flows of a natural watercourse
undiverted or introducing previously stored water into a
natural watercourse to benefit trout populations in
Wyoming;

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23 (vi) For a temporary change application pursuant 24 to this section that involves a water right historically

1 used for an agricultural beneficial use, the right shall 2 return to the same land and original purpose when the term 3 of the temporary change for trout fishery purposes has 4 expired. If at any time during the period of temporary use 5 the ownership of the encumbered water right is severed from the ownership of the land or is the subject of a change of 6 7 use or place of use application or any other petition with the board of control which would preclude use of the water 8 9 right for its original agricultural purpose, the temporary 10 water right for trout fishery purposes shall immediately 11 become null and void;

(vii) For direct flow water rights only that
portion of a water right so acquired which has been
consumptively used under the historical use made of the
water right, may be used by a temporary user. For
temporary uses that involve transferring stored water from
a consumptive to trout fishery purpose, reductions to
account for conveyance losses may be required;

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(viii) In determining the consumptive use of water rights for the use of the natural direct flow of any stream for irrigation purposes, the return flow from those rights shall be presumed to be fifty percent (50%). In

1 situations where an assumption of fifty percent (50%) 2 return flow would be significantly in error, the state 3 engineer may make a determination of the actual amount of 4 return flow and the amount of water which is available to 5 be used shall be adjusted accordingly. The historic return flow or the assumed return flow of fifty percent 6 stream for shall be left 7 in the the use of appropriators. The foregoing formula and procedure for the 8 determination of consumptive use and return flow shall be 9 10 limited to this section and W.S. 41-3-110(c) and shall have 11 no application to any other statute of this state. 12 in this section shall be treated or construed as changing 13 the prior use of water held by the owner or owners and as 14 provided by the laws of this state. 15

16 Nothing in this section shall be construed to 17 supersede, impair or abrogate the rights of the state of Wyoming to fully utilize and appropriate to consumptive 18 beneficial use those quantities of water allocated to the 19 20 state of Wyoming by interstate compact or United States 21 supreme court decree. The state engineer shall not grant a 22 temporary change of use application for trout fishery purposes where the undiverted natural flows would be 23 24 included as a portion of the consumptive share of water

1 allocated to the state of Wyoming under any interstate

2 compact or decree. The amount of water appropriated for

3 temporary trout fishery purposes in each river basin in

4 Wyoming shall not result in more water leaving the state

5 than the amount of water that is allocated by interstate

6 compact or court decree for downstream uses outside

7 Wyoming.

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9 (d) In accordance with the provisions of W.S.

10 41-3-506, any change of use authorized under this section

11 may be suspended at any time upon a determination of the

12 superintendent of the water division within which the

13 temporary change of use occurs that the temporary change

14 produces unanticipated injury to other water users. The

15 suspension shall be subject to timely review by the state

16 engineer.

17

18 (e) Any request for regulation to benefit a temporary

19 trout fishery water use acquired under this section shall

20 be made in writing in accordance with the provisions of

21 W.S. 41-3-606.

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23 (f) Notice for any measuring device necessary to

24 monitor or regulate a temporary trout fishery use acquired

1 under this section shall be required under the provisions

2 of W.S. 41-3-613. The party acquiring a temporary use for

3 such purpose, as designated on the state engineer's order

4 approving the temporary use, shall be responsible for

5 providing and installing any measuring device and securing

6 access necessary to install and maintain the device needed

7 for regulation or monitoring of stream flow as determined

8 by the state engineer or superintendent of the water

9 division within which the use is located. Any measuring

10 device or adjustable and lockable headgate, if needed on

11 any diversion within the affected stream reach for proper

12 regulation of the temporary trout fishery use, shall be the

13 responsibility of the owner of the diversion.

14

15 (g) Nothing in this section shall grant nor shall it

16 be construed to grant the right of ingress or egress

17 through or upon private property to reach streams where

18 temporary trout fishery flows are maintained, nor shall it

19 operate or be so construed as to grant any right of eminent

20 domain to acquire the right of ingress or egress through

21 private property to any waters so maintained.

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23 (h) A new temporary change of use application for

24 fishery purposes may be filed using the same procedures as

1 obtaining an initial temporary change of use under this

2 section.

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4 (j) The state engineer shall assess a fee not to

5 exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for his review and

6 approval of an application pursuant to this section. This

7 fee shall accompany the application and shall be retained

8 and credited to the general fund whether the application is

9 approved or denied.

10

11 (k) The state engineer's office shall submit to the

12 governor and the legislature:

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14 (i) During the first five (5) years of the pilot

15 temporary change and conserved water for trout fishery

16 purposes program, an annual study progress report

17 documenting any application approved pursuant to this

18 section during the previous year;

19

20 (ii) A five (5) year study progress report not

21 later than December 1, 2014, including the information

22 specified in subsection (a) of this section for each

23 temporary change application for trout fishery purposes

24 granted under subsection (b) of this section; and

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(iii) A final study report not later than

December 1, 2019 which summarizes the ten (10) year program

including recommendations for future direction regarding

either the extension or termination of the right to

temporarily use water rights for trout fishery purposes in

Wyoming.

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9 (m) This section is repealed effective July 1, 2019.

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41-3-117. Conserved water projects for landowner
12 flexibility and trout fishery purposes; right to use
13 conserved water temporarily for trout fishery purposes;
14 sunset provision.

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16 (a) On and after July 1, 2009, a holder of a water
17 right who conserves water may voluntarily and temporarily
18 transfer the conserved water to a fishery purpose pursuant
19 to W.S. 41-3-116. Temporary change applications approved
20 pursuant to this section shall be allowed only if no other
21 appropriator is injured thereby.

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23 (b) As used in this section, "conserved water" means 24 water made available for trout fishery purposes from an

1 existing valid appropriation through application of water2 saving methods.

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4 (c) This section is repealed effective July 1, 2019.

5

6 **Section 2.** It is the declared policy of this state to 7 encourage the conservation of water including the filing of

8 temporary change of water use applications which maintain

9 irrigated acres while at the same time providing public

10 benefits in terms of improved trout fishery health.

11

12 **Section 3.** This act is effective July 1, 2009.
