State parks-acquisition of lands.

Sponsored by: Joint Travel, Recreation, Wildlife and  
Cultural Resources Interim Committee

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to state parks and cultural resources;  
2 authorizing the acceptance of lands as specified;  
3 authorizing the purchase of lands from the state board of  
4 land commissioners as specified; providing an  
5 appropriation; and providing for an effective date.

7 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

9 **Section 1.**

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11 (a) The legislature authorizes the acceptance of the  
12 following lands to be managed by the department of state  
13 parks and historic sites upon final negotiation with the  
14 appropriate parties:

15

1           (i) Forty (40) acres of land in the NW 1/4 of  
2 the SW 1/4 of Section 23, Township 27 North, Range 66 West  
3 in Platte County known commonly as the Historic Golf Course  
4 at Guernsey State Park.

5  
6           (b) The board of land commissioners is authorized and  
7 directed to convey its right, title and interest, in the  
8 surface estate of the following described parcel of land to  
9 the department of state parks and cultural resources:

10  
11           (i) For inclusion into Curt Gowdy state park,  
12 one hundred fifty-seven (157) acres of land located in the  
13 North 1/2 of Section 16, Township 14 North, Range 70 West  
14 and in the North 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 of Section 16,  
15 Township 14 North, Range 70 West.

16  
17           **Section 2.**

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19           (a) There is appropriated an amount not to exceed  
20 five hundred ninety-five thousand six hundred dollars  
21 (\$595,600.00) from the budget reserve account to the state  
22 board of land commissioners for the period beginning with  
23 the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2012 for

1 purposes of funding the purchase provided in section 1(b)  
2 of this act.

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4           **Section 3.**     This act is effective immediately upon  
5     completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law  
6     as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming  
7     Constitution.
