Eighty miles per hour speed limit.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to speed limits; establishing a maximum
2 speed limit declarable by state authorities; modifying and
3 clarifying the state superintendent's ability to designate
4 higher speed limits; amending the identification of
5 speeding violations that are kept in state records; and
6 providing for an effective date.

8 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

10 **Section 1.** W.S. 31-5-301(b)(iii)(A) and (d) and
11 31-5-302 are amended to read:

12

13 **31-5-301. Maximum speed limits.**

14

15 (b) Except when a special hazard exists that requires
16 lower speed for compliance with subsection (a) of this

1 section, subject to W.S. 31-5-203(b), the limits specified
2 in this subsection or established as otherwise authorized
3 shall be maximum lawful speeds and no person shall drive a
4 vehicle on a highway at a speed in excess of maximum
5 limits:

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7 (iii) Seventy-five (75) miles per hour on
8 interstate highways. Nothing in this paragraph shall be
9 construed to:

11 (A) Affect the authority of the
12 superintendent to otherwise designate lower or higher
13 maximum speed limits on interstate highways ~~except as~~
14 ~~provided for in W.S. 31-5-303(b)~~ in accordance with other
15 laws; or

16
17 (d) Speeding violations of up to eighty (80) miles
18 per hour where the posted speed limit is at least sixty-
19 five (65) miles per hour but not more than seventy-five
20 (75) miles per hour, or less than six (6) miles per hour
21 over the posted speed limit in all other instances and
22 zones, except violations for exceeding the speed limit in a
23 school zone, or construction zone, and violations received
24 while operating a commercial motor vehicle as defined by

1 W.S. 31-7-102(a)(viii), shall not be made a part of the
2 abstracts or records kept by the department of
3 transportation pursuant to W.S. 31-5-1214 or 31-7-120.

5 **31-5-302. Establishment of specific maximum speed**
6 **limits by superintendent.**

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8 Whenever the superintendent determines upon the basis of an
9 engineering and traffic investigation, or in the event of a
10 vehicle or weather emergency, that a maximum speed greater
11 or less than that authorized herein is ~~required for~~ safe
12 and reasonable ~~vehicle operation~~ under the conditions found
13 to exist at any intersection or other place or upon any
14 part of the state highway system, the superintendent,
15 except as provided for in W.S. 31-5-303(b), may determine
16 and declare a reasonable and safe maximum limit thereat,
17 which shall be effective when appropriate signs giving
18 notice thereof are erected and which shall not exceed
19 eighty (80) miles per hour on interstate highways. The
20 maximum speed limit may be declared to be effective at all
21 times or at such times as are indicated upon the signs and
22 differing limits may be established for different times of
23 day, different types of vehicles, varying weather
24 conditions, and other factors bearing on safe speeds, which

1 shall be effective when posted upon appropriate fixed or
2 variable signs. This section does not grant power to the
3 superintendent to declare statewide or countywide maximum
4 speed limits but grants power to declare maximum speed
5 limits for the public safety in localized geographic areas.
