A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to revision of inadvertent errors;
2 correcting statutory references and language resulting from
3 inadvertent errors and omissions in previously adopted
4 legislation; correcting obsolete references; specifying
5 applicability; and providing for an effective date.

7 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

8

9 **Section 1.** W.S. 1-37-101, 9-17-111(b)(intro),
10 21-3-110(a)(x)(B), 27-1-102, 27-1-103, 28-8-105(b)(iii),
11 35-7-1036(b)(intro) and 41-10-101(b) are amended to read:

13 **1-37-101. Short title.**

14

15 "This act" means W.S. 1-37-101 through ~~1-37-114~~ 1-37-115
16 and may be cited as the Uniform Declaratory Judgments Act.

17

1 **9-17-111. Disposition of lottery proceeds.**

2

3 (b) On or before the fifteenth day of each quarter,

4 the corporation shall transfer to the treasurer's office,

5 for credit to the lottery account which is hereby created,

6 the amount of all net proceeds minus prizes and amounts

7 earned pursuant to subsection (a) of this section during

8 the preceding quarter. Upon their deposit into the

9 account, any monies representing a deposit of net proceeds

10 shall then become the unencumbered property of the state of

11 Wyoming and the corporation shall have no power to agree or

12 undertake otherwise. Until June 30, 2019, the first six

13 million dollars (\$6,000,000.00) in each fiscal year of

14 these monies shall be paid by the treasurer as they accrue

15 to the treasurers of the counties, cities and towns for

16 payment into their respective general funds. The percentage

17 of the balance that will be distributed to each county and

18 its cities and towns will be determined by computing the

19 percentage that net sales taxes collected attributable to

20 ~~vendors~~retailers in each county including its cities and

21 towns bear to total net sales taxes collected of ~~vendors~~

22 retailers in all counties including their cities and towns.

23 This percentage of the monies shall be distributed within

24 each county as follows:

2 **21-3-110. Duties of boards of trustees.**

3

4 (a) The board of trustees in each school district
5 shall:

7 (x) Subject to review by the school facilities
8 department under W.S. 21-15-115 for any project involving
9 state capital construction assistance, fix the site of each
10 school building and facility considering the needs of the
11 people of each portion of the district. If the district
12 enters into an agreement to lease buildings and facilities
13 owned by the district and the buildings and facilities are
14 included within the statewide database maintained by the
15 school facilities department under W.S. 21-15-123(f)(iv),
16 the district shall, except as provided under W.S.
17 21-15-109(c)(i)(A)(II) and (III) and (B), ensure the lease
18 agreement requires sufficient payment from the lessee to
19 cover expenses necessary to adequately maintain the
20 facility or building in accordance with statewide adequacy
21 standards prescribed by the commission. If the district
22 enters into an agreement to lease buildings and facilities
23 under which the district is the lessee and the building is
24 to be used for the provision of the required educational

1 program within the district, the lease agreement shall
2 require the lessor to adequately maintain the buildings and
3 facilities in accordance with standards prescribed by the
4 commission. The district shall be reimbursed for the lease
5 payment if the square footage of the leased facility is not
6 included within the district's total square footage for
7 purposes of major maintenance computations under W.S.
8 21-15-109, subject to the following:

10 (B) If the lease payment is for facilities
11 leased to the district by a state institution which meets
12 state adequacy standards prescribed by rule and regulation
13 of the commission, the amount of the lease reimbursement
14 paid by the school facilities department shall not include
15 the amount received by the institution from the state for
16 major building and facility repair and replacement costs
17 attributable to the facility, as computed by the
18 construction management ~~section~~program within the general
19 services division of the department of administration and
20 information.

22 **27-1-102. Doors at public places to open outward;**
23 **handrails on stairs; enforcement.**

1 All doors leading into or to any manufacturing
2 establishment, mills, workshops, offices, bakeries,
3 laundries, stores, hotels, theaters, halls, or other
4 buildings in which people are employed, shall be so
5 constructed as to open outward, when practicable, and shall
6 not be locked, bolted or fastened so as to prevent free
7 egress during working hours. Proper and substantial
8 handrails shall be provided on all stairways in
9 manufacturing establishments, mills, workshops, offices,
10 bakeries, laundries, stores, hotels, theaters, halls, and
11 other buildings where people are employed or rooms are
12 rented to the public. ~~And he~~ The department of workforce
13 services shall have authority to enforce by due process of
14 law, the provisions of this section, and other laws
15 relating to fire escapes.

16

17 **27-1-103. Safety devices on elevators and machinery.**

18

19 The openings of all hoistways, hatchways, elevators, well
20 holes and stairways in manufacturing establishments, mills,
21 workshops, bakeries, laundries, stores, hotels, theaters,
22 halls, or any other kind of establishment where labor is
23 employed, or machinery used, shall be protected by
24 trapdoors, hatches, fences, automatic gates or other

1 safeguards, and all due diligence shall be used to keep all
2 such means of protection closed, except when it is
3 necessary to have the same open for use when practicable.
4 All machinery, in use in any mercantile, manufacturing, or
5 any other establishment whatsoever where labor is employed,
6 shall be equipped, with proper shifters for throwing on or
7 off pulleys, loose pulleys and other such safeguards as may
8 be deemed necessary by the ~~commissioner of labor~~ department
9 of workforce services for the proper safeguard of life and
10 limb.

11

12 **28-8-105. Duties of director and staff; prefiling**
13 **bills; fiscal notes.**

14

15 (b) Bills or files, resolutions or memorials may be
16 prefiled by any person who will be a member of the next
17 session of the legislature after the general election and
18 prior to the convening of a regular session of the
19 legislature. They shall be submitted to the director in
20 such form as is in accordance with the most recent rules
21 and practices. Each submittal shall bear the signature of
22 the authorized person submitting it and shall be approved
23 as to form by the director. A bill, file, resolution, or
24 memorial is prefiled when written approval by the sponsor

1 is received by the legislative service office. Promptly
2 upon receipt of the draft of the bill or file, resolution
3 or memorial to be prefiled, the office shall:

5 (iii) Forward to each requesting legislator and
6 legislator-elect of the pending legislative session ~~and to~~
7 ~~each county clerk~~ printed copies of each item of prefiled
8 legislation, resolution and memorial so prefiled.

10 **35-7-1036. Distribution to person under 18; drug free**

13 (b) Any person who is convicted of any of the
14 following listed offenses with regard to a controlled
15 substance listed in Schedules I through IV shall have the
16 penalties specified in this subsection imposed as part of
17 the sentence and in addition to any other penalties
18 authorized by law, if that offense was committed within any
19 school bus as defined in W.S. ~~31-7-102(a)(xix)~~
20 31-7-102(a)(x1) or within the boundaries of or within five
21 hundred (500) feet of the boundaries of real property used
22 by a school district primarily for the education of any
23 student in any grade from kindergarten through twelfth
24 grade:

Section 2. Any other act adopted by the Wyoming legislature during the same session in which this act is adopted shall be given precedence and shall prevail over the amendments in this act to the extent that such acts are in conflict with this act.

16 **Section 3.** This act is effective immediately upon
17 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
18 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
19 Constitution.
