A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the legislature; extending authorization
2 to participate in the energy producing states coalition as
3 specified; requiring a report; providing an appropriation;
4 and providing for an effective date.

6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

8 **Section 1.**

10 (a) The participation of Wyoming legislators in the
11 energy producing states coalition, authorized by 2011
12 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 92, Section 1, reauthorized
13 by 2012 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 82, Section 1 and
14 2015 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 142, Section 4, Section
15 349 is hereby continued.

2 (b) Legislators appointed pursuant to this act shall
3 be authorized by the management council of the legislature
4 to attend meetings as the council determines necessary to
5 accomplish the purposes of this act and 2011 Wyoming
6 Session Laws, Chapter 92, Section 1(a), and shall receive
7 salary, per diem and mileage for the performance of their
8 duties under this act as provided in W.S. 28-5-101.
9 Appointed legislators shall provide a single report to the
10 council not later than October 1 of each year, including
11 any suggested legislation for referral to the appropriate
12 legislative committee for consideration.

14 (c) In addition to the requirements of subsection (b)
15 of this section, the appropriation contained in section 2
16 of this act may be expended to coordinate and provide
17 meeting facilities and other requirements for the energy
18 producing states coalition with the approval of management
19 council.

20

21 **Section 2.** For purposes of this act, there is
22 appropriated from the general fund fifty thousand five
23 hundred dollars (\$50,500.00) to the legislative service

1 office. This appropriation shall be for the period
2 beginning with the effective date of this act and ending
3 June 30, 2018.

4

5 **Section 3.** This act is effective July 1, 2016.
