A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming lottery; modifying
2 disposition of lottery proceeds as specified; and providing
3 for an effective date.

5 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-17-111(b)(intro) is amended to
8 read:

10 **9-17-111. Disposition of lottery proceeds.**

12 (b) On or before the fifteenth day of each quarter,
13 the corporation shall transfer to the treasurer's office,
14 for credit to the lottery account which is hereby created,
15 the amount of all net proceeds minus prizes and amounts

1 earned pursuant to subsection (a) of this section during
2 the preceding quarter. Upon their deposit into the
3 account, any monies representing a deposit of net proceeds
4 shall then become the unencumbered property of the state of
5 Wyoming and the corporation shall have no power to agree or
6 undertake otherwise. ~~Until June 30, 2022, the first six~~
7 ~~million dollars (\$6,000,000.00) in each fiscal year of~~ At
8 least once per fiscal year, these monies shall be paid by
9 the treasurer ~~as they accrue~~ to the treasurers of the
10 counties, cities and towns for payment into their
11 respective general funds. The percentage of the balance
12 that will be distributed to each county and its cities and
13 towns will be determined by computing the percentage that
14 net sales taxes collected attributable to vendors as
15 defined in W.S. 39-15-101(a)(xv) in each county including
16 its cities and towns bear to total net sales taxes
17 collected of vendors as defined in W.S. 39-15-101(a)(xv) in
18 all counties including their cities and towns. This
19 percentage of the monies shall be distributed within each
20 county as follows:

22 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-17-111(c) is repealed.
