Catch Title: Senior citizen district elections.

Subject: Modifying term lengths and property tax authorization for senior citizen service districts.

Summary/Major Elements:

- Currently, Wyoming law requires a senior citizen service district to hold an election every two years for the district electors to reauthorize the district's authority to levy a property tax. The voters must also reelect the district's board of directors every two years.
- This bill amends the election requirement so the voters in a senior citizen service district can authorize the district's taxation authority for four years.
- The bill also amends the term lengths for district board members. Board members will now be elected to four year, staggered terms. The district will either elect two or three board members every two years.

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
