5 Page 142-lines 1 through 8 Delete entirely and insert:

7 "(a) In coordination with the office of the governor, the
8 Wyoming business council shall solicit proposals for the
9 continued operation of an automotive technology trade school.
10 Proposals may be submitted by private entities and by Wyoming
11 community college districts. The council shall require of
12 private entities submitting proposals:

14 (i) A business plan containing information that is
15 sufficient for the council to evaluate management experience of
16 principals, current financial position, details of proposed
17 operation of the trade school, projected enrollments and
18 projected profitability of the operation of the trade school;

20 (ii) Assets of the entity which would be pledged as
21 collateral for any loan under this section;

23 (iii) The amount of loan sought and proposed interest
24 rate, term and repayment schedule for any loan under this
25 section;

27 (iv) An estimate of jobs to be filled in the operation
28 of the trade school, including the number and type of jobs that
29 are full-time, part-time, skilled, semiskilled or unskilled
30 positions;

32 (v) Other information the council deems advisable to
33 evaluate all proposals under this section, both individually and
34 in relative terms to other proposals from private entities or
35 community colleges.

37 (b) The council shall require of community college
38 districts submitting proposals:

2 (i) Identification of the amount of grant sought by
3 the district and the proposed terms and conditions of any grant;

5 (ii) Identification of equipment and the value of the
6 equipment anticipated to be donated to the district or purchased
7 by the district from grant funds;

9 (iii) Identification of any binding commitment of non-
10 state funds from one (1) or more political subdivisions
11 contingent on approval of the proposal;

13 (iv) Expected requests for annual state appropriations
14 for the operation of the automotive technology school program;
15

16 (v) Anticipated increased mill levy funding within the
17 district to operate the automotive technology school program;
18

19 (vi) An estimate of jobs to be filled in the operation
20 of the trade school, including the number and type of jobs that
21 are full-time, part-time, skilled, semiskilled or unskilled
22 positions;

24 (vii) Other information the council deems advisable to
25 evaluate all proposals under this section, both individually and
26 in relative terms to other proposals from community colleges and
27 from private entities.

29 (c) The business council shall evaluate all proposals
30 received and recommend to the governor funding of the proposal
31 which provides the greatest benefit to the state, based upon
32 direct returns of funding provided under this section, the
33 likelihood of continued operation of the trade school in the
34 foreseeable future, and anticipated direct and indirect revenues
35 and costs to the state. The recommendation of the council shall
36 be submitted on or before April 1, 2018. The governor may
37 provide a loan to a private entity or a grant to a community
38 college under the provisions of this section, or may decline to
39 fund any and all proposals, in his sole discretion, but not more
40 than one (1) proposal shall be funded under this section.

42 (d) The governor may approve an initial grant of up to two
43 million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000.00) to a
44 community college district subject to the following:".

1 "(iii) Consistent with W.S. 21-18-310, the board of
2 county commissioners of the county in which the automotive
3 technology trade school is located shall pass a resolution
4 requesting that the county be annexed into a community college
5 district. The resolution shall be passed by such date as will
6 provide for an election on the annexation question at either the
7 2018 primary or general election. The provisions of W.S.
8 21-18-310 shall govern subsequent actions relating to the
9 annexation.".

17 "(f) If the community college district makes a favorable
18 recommendation under paragraph (e)(i) of this section and the

20 two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000.00)
21 appropriated under subsection (h) of this section shall be made
22 available to the community college district for fiscal year 2020
23 operational costs relating to the school.

25 (g) If the governor determines to provide a loan to a
26 private entity under this section, the loan shall:

28 (i) Be approved as to form by the attorney general;

30 (ii) Contain an interest rate of two and one-half
31 percent (2.5%) per annum;

33 (iii) Provide a maximum repayment term of ten (10)
34 years;

36 (iv) Require a mortgage covering all or any part of
37 the project or by a pledge of the lease of the project;

39 (v) Provide for any other security device or
40 requirement deemed advantageous or necessary by the governor.".

17 for purposes of a loan to a private entity in accordance with
18 subsections (a) and (g) of this section. The governor may
19 combine funds authorized under this section with any funds
20 appropriated under subsection (h) of this section, as he deems
21 appropriate, but the total amount of any loan under this section
22 shall not exceed five million dollars (\$5,000,000.00).".
