Catch Title: **Municipal jurisdiction.**

Subject: Municipal extraterritorial jurisdiction.

Summary/Major Elements:

- This act restricts a municipality's current authority to exercise jurisdiction within one-half mile of its boundaries for any unincorporated area in a county which has officially adopted a comprehensive plan. The act provides that with the consent of a municipality, a comprehensive plan may delegate functions to the municipality in whole or in part and exclusively or concurrently with county performance of the functions.
- The act restricts a municipality's current authority to exercise jurisdiction within five miles of its boundaries for urban renewal projects for any incorporated area unless a resolution has been adopted by the county commissioners consenting to the jurisdiction.
- The act also restricts a municipality's current authority to exercise jurisdiction within one mile of its boundaries for approval of plats in an area not subject to regulation under and pursuant to a comprehensive plan. If a plat is located within a certain distance of the boundaries of a city or town and city or town approval of the plat is not required, the act requires the board of county commissioners prior to approving the proposed plat or development to solicit and consider comments from the governing body of the city or town relating to impacts to the city or town's infrastructure or other development plans.
