## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to physical therapy; modifying the scope of

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5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 33-25-102(c)(intro) and
- 8 33-25-111(a)(xii) are amended to read:

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- 10 33-25-102. Practice of physical therapy; license or
- 11 certificate required; exceptions; false representations.

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- 13 (c) Except as provided in this subsection, a physical
- 14 therapist with a master's degree, or a bachelor's degree with
- 15 five (5) years of clinical experience may initiate physical

1 therapy treatment for a new or recurring injury with or 2 without a prescription from a licensed physician including 3 doctor of osteopathy, podiatrist, advanced practitioner of 4 nursing, dentist, chiropractor or physician assistant. 5 Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to preclude a 6 physical therapist from treating a chronic or recurring 7 injury or condition without a prescription, provided that the patient or client was previously diagnosed and prescribed 8 9 physical therapy treatment within the previous year by a 10 health care provider identified in this subsection and the 11 treatment is directly related to the original prescribed 12 care. Except in an emergency, a physical therapist, without a prescription, is prohibited from initiating physical 13 therapy treatment for children under the age of twelve (12) 14 years, unless the child is to receive physical therapy 15 16 treatment under an individualized education program or an 17 individualized family services plan. A physical therapist shall refer the patient or client to a licensed physician 18 19 including doctor of osteopathy, podiatrist, advanced 20 practitioner of nursing, dentist, chiropractor or physician 21 assistant, as appropriate, when: or other health care provider, except that a physical therapist shall refer a 22 patient or client to another health care provider to diagnose 23

3	present that require health care services beyond the scope of
4	physical therapy practice, or physical therapy is
5	contraindicated. A physical therapist shall only administer
6	an electrodiagnostic test if the patient who is to receive

8	licensed physician who is a physiatrist or neurologist or if
9	the test is conducted in a hospital setting with orders from
10	a licensed physician.
