A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the administration of government;
- 2 modifying provisions relating to the procurement of services
- 3 by public entities; subjecting school districts to the

- 6 applicability; and providing for an effective date.

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- 10 **Section 1**. W.S. 9-2-1028(a)(i) and (iv), 9-2-1030(b),
- 11 9-2-1031(b) and (c), 16-6-112(a)(intro) and 21-3-110(a)(viii)

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14 **9-2-1028.** Definitions.

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1 (a) As used in this act: 2 3 (i) "Agency" means any school district, state 4 office, department, board, commission, institution or other operating entity of the state excluding the University of 5 Wyoming, community college districts, school districts, the 6 Wyoming business council and the Wyoming department of 7 8 transportation; 9 10 (iv) "Principal representative" means the 11 governing board of a school district, department, institution 12 or agency or its designated representative, or, if there is no governing board, the executive head of a department, 13 institution or agency; 14 15 16 9-2-1030. Qualification procedures. 17 (b) 18 If professional services in an amount exceeding 19 five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) twenty-five thousand 20 dollars (\$25,000.00) are required, the department or the agency shall notify all qualified architects, engineers and 21 land surveyors of record who have submitted an annual 22

statement of qualifications and performance data. In addition

1 if professional services in an amount exceeding fifty 2 thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) are required, the agency or the 3 department shall give statewide notice in a newspaper of 4 statewide general circulation in the state at least once each week for four (4) two (2) consecutive weeks prior to 5 initiation of selection procedures in accordance with W.S. 6 9-2-1031. Notification All notifications under this 7 8 subsection shall contain a general description of the 9 proposed project, and shall indicate the procedures by which 10 interested firms may apply for consideration for a contract

to provide professional services for the proposed project.

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13 **9-2-1031.** Selection procedures.

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15 In addition to the requirements of subsection (a) (b) 16 of this section, for any professional services fee estimated 17 by the agency to exceed twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) or, for any project the total cost of which is 18 19 estimated to exceed one hundred thousand dollars 20 (\$100,000.00) <u>fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00)</u>, the 21 principal representative shall interview not less than three 22 (3) firms selected from those which have submitted proposals 23 to do the work. The interview shall be recorded and include

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1 discussion of each firm's projections of project costs, qualifications, approaches to the project, ability to furnish 2 3 required professional services, use of alternative methods 4 for furnishing required professional services and 5 estimated fee based on the agency's description of the work. The estimated fee may be used as a basis, along with the 6 qualifications listed in subsection (a) of this section, for 7 8 selection by the principal representative of the most 9 qualified firm for contract negotiations. If unsatisfied with 10 the results of such interviews, the principal representative 11 may select not less than three (3) additional firms for 12 interviews as provided by subsection (a) of this section. 13 14 In addition to the requirements of subsection (a) 15 of this section, for any professional services fee estimated 16 by the agency to be twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) 17 fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) or less, or for any project the total cost of which is estimated to be one hundred 18 19 thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) or less, the principal 20 representative shall select three (3) firms from which a 21 project specific submittal shall be requested. The information provided by the firm shall include an estimated 22

fee and preliminary scope of services based on the agency's

- 1 description of the work. The estimated fee may be used as a
- 2 basis along with the qualifications listed in subsection (a)
- 3 of this section, for selection by the principal
- 4 representative of the most qualified firm for contract
- 5 negotiations.

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- 7 16-6-112. Contractor's bond or other guarantee; when
- 8 required; conditions; amount; approval; filing; enforcement
- 9 upon default.

- 11 (a) Except as provided under W.S. 9-2-3004(c)(iv), any
- 12 contract entered into with the state, any county, city, town,
- 13 school district or other political subdivision of the state
- 14 for the construction, major maintenance or renovation of any
- 15 public building or other public structure or for any public
- 16 work or improvement and the contract price exceeds seven
- 17 thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500.00) fifty thousand
- 18 <u>dollars (\$50,000.00)</u>, shall require any contractor before
- 19 beginning work under the contract to furnish the state or any
- 20 political subdivision, as appropriate, a bond or if the
- 21 contract price is one hundred fifty thousand dollars
- 22 (\$150,000.00) or less, any other form of guarantee approved

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by the state or the political subdivision. The bond or other
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    form of guarantee shall be:
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         21-3-110. Duties of boards of trustees.
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              The board of trustees in each school district

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    shall:
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              (viii) Obtain competitive bids when any school
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    building is to be built, when any repairs, additions or
    improvements costing more than ten thousand dollars
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    ($10,000.00) and less than twenty five thousand dollars
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    ($25,000.00) are to be made to any school building, facility
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    or other district property, or when any purchase of insurance,
    supplies or materials other than textbooks costing more than
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    ten thousand dollars ($10,000.00) and less than twenty-five
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    thousand dollars ($25,000.00) is contemplated unless
    precluded by other regulation or statute. If the amount of
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    the purchase of insurance, supplies or materials other than
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    textbooks is equal to or exceeds twenty-five thousand dollars
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    ($25,000.00), a call for bids shall be published at least
    once in a newspaper of general circulation in the district.
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    When any school building is to be built costing fifty thousand
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| 1 | dollars (\$50,000.00) or more or when any repairs, additions |
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| 2 | or improvements costing fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) |
| 3 | or more are to be made to any school building, facility or |
| 4 | other district property, the board shall obtain competitive |
| 5 | bids and publish a call for bids in a newspaper of general |
| 6 | circulation in the state at least once each week for two (2) |
| 7 | consecutive weeks. The district shall reserve the right to |
| 8 | reject any and all bids and to waive irregularities and |
| 9 | informalities in the bidding. No contract shall be divided |
| 10 | for the purpose of avoiding this paragraph. Items for which |
| 11 | bids must be obtained may be described in the published call |
| 12 | for bids by stating general requirements and making detailed |
| 13 | specifications available to prospective bidders at the |
| 14 | district's administrative headquarters. The requirements of |
| 15 | this paragraph shall not apply to the procurement of |
| 16 | professional services of architects, engineers or surveyors |
| 17 | when the board seeks to procure professional services |
| 18 | pursuant to W.S. 9-2-1027 through 9-2-1033; |
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| 20 | Section 2. This act shall apply only to procurement |

activities initiated on or after the effective date of this

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act.

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Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
