A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to community college and school district funding; providing for quarterly distribution of major 2 maintenance funding to community colleges and 3 school 4 districts; increasing the amount that may be spent on a capital construction project without legislative approval; 5 increasing the percentage of unrestricted community college 6 7 operating funds which may be carried forward to subsequent 8 biennial periods; and providing for effective dates. 9 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 11

12 Section 1. W.S. 21-18-205(f) and (g) is amended to 13 read:

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15 21-18-205. Appropriation and distribution of state
16 funds; restrictions; budget authority.

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2	(f) Up to eight percent (8%) <u>fifteen percent (15%)</u> of
3	each community college's unrestricted operating funds for a
4	biennium may be carried forward into the next biennium by
5	each community college. The cumulative total amount of
6	unrestricted operating funds carried forward from previous
7	bienniums shall never exceed eight percent (8%) <u>fifteen</u>
8	percent (15%) of the community college's current biennium
9	unrestricted operating funds. Funds carried forward in
10	accordance with this subsection shall not lapse pursuant to
11	W.S. 9-4-207.
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13	(g) No state funds shall be used for the maintaining,
14	operating or equipping of any capital construction project in
15	excess of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) one million
16	five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000.00) which was not

17 approved by the commission and authorized by the legislature. 18

19 Section 2. W.S. 21-15-109(b) and 21-18-225(k) are 20 amended to read:

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21-15-109. Major building and facility repair and
replacement payments; computation; square footage allowance;
use of payment funds; accounting and reporting requirements.

5 To the extent funds are available, on July 1 of (b) each year, the state construction department shall, based 6 upon square footage computations computed from the prior 7 8 school year, distribute seventy five percent (75%) of the 9 estimated major building and facility repair and replacement 10 payments in quarterly installments to each school district 11 from the school capital construction account. On or before 12 September 30 of each year the department shall distribute the 13 balance of payments to each school district. The department shall distribute the first quarterly payment on July 1 of 14 each fiscal year, with the remaining payments distributed on 15 16 October 1, January 2 and April 1. Payments shall be made as 17 equal as reasonably possible. If funds within the account 18 are not sufficient for payments of any school year any 19 quarterly payment, the department shall reduce all district 20 payments for that quarter by a uniform percentage. The 21 department shall also increase or reduce a subsequent school district payment, as appropriate, in the event a school 22 district receives an excessive or deficient distribution. 23

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Major building and facility repair and replacement payments
shall be computed in accordance with subsection (c) of this
section.

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5 21-18-225. College maintenance and capital 6 construction funding.

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8 (k) Appropriations for major maintenance shall be 9 distributed by the state construction department to community 10 colleges <u>in equal quarterly installments</u> in amounts 11 determined by the funding formula developed by the state 12 building commission, subject to restrictions imposed on 13 qualifying square footage pursuant to this section. The state construction department shall distribute the first quarterly 14 payment on July 1 of each fiscal year, with the remaining 15 16 payments distributed on October 1, January 2 and April 1. 17 18 Section 3. 19

20 (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of 21 this section, this act is effective July 1, 2020.

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(b) Section 1 of this act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution. (END)
