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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 12-2-203(g), 12-4-103(a)(vi) and
- 8 12-5-401 are amended to read:

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- 13 (g) The local licensing authority may issue to the
- 14 holder of a manufacturer's license granted under subsection

1 (a) of this section who is a federally licensed distiller or

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4 (i) A satellite manufacturer's permit which allows the permittee to sell product manufactured at the site 5 identified on the manufacturer's license at not more than one 6 (1) satellite location within Wyoming separate from its 7 manufacturing site under the original permit. All products 8 sold at a manufacturer's satellite location shall be obtained 9 10 through the division. The satellite manufacturer's permit may 11 issued on application to the appropriate licensing 12 authority. The local licensing authority may require a public 13 hearing and the payment of an additional permit fee not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00). 14 The satellite 15 manufacturer's permit shall be subject to the terms and 16 conditions of W.S. 12-4-106, the schedule of operating hours set pursuant to W.S. 12-5-101 and the licensed building 17 provisions pursuant to W.S. 12-5-201; 18
