14 **20-2-303.** Definitions.

16 (a) As used in this article:

2	(iv) "Contributing substantially" means a
3	material contribution toward the child's support that
4	provides something of real value and that is important to
5	fulfill a present need of the child. "Contributing
6	substantially" shall not include contributions for nominal
7	expenses, contributions that have no value, are superfluous
8	or are contributions made against an existing court order;

10	(iv)(v) "This article" means W.S. 20-2-301 through
11	20-2-315.

13	20-2-307. Presumptive child support to be followed;
14	deviations by court.
15	
16	(e) The court may order a party who intentionally
17	misrepresents to the court any substantial contribution the
18	party makes on the child's behalf or any fact related to the
19	factors specified in subsection (b) of this section to pay
20	reasonable attorney fees and court costs incurred as a result
21	of the intentional misrepresentation to the other party.

Section 2. This act shall apply to any proceeding to
establish or modify temporary or permanent child support
filed on or after the effective date of this act.

Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2019.
