A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to government; continuing the educational
- 2 attainment executive council; amending membership of the
- 3 council as specified; providing duties; providing for
- 4 staffing; requiring reports; providing an appropriation; and
- 5 providing for an effective date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8

9 Section 1.

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- 11 (a) The purpose of this act is to continue the work of
- 12 the educational attainment executive council, created by
- 13 executive order 2018-4. The educational attainment executive
- 14 council is continued and shall consist of the following eleven

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15 (11) members:

1	(i) The president of the University of Wyoming or
2	a designee, who shall serve as a council co-chairman;
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4	(ii) A president of a Wyoming community college as
5	selected by the community colleges' presidents council or a
6	designee of the selected Wyoming community college president,
7	who shall serve as a council co-chairman;
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9	(iii) The superintendent of public instruction or
10	a designee;
11	
12	(iv) One (1) member of the executive council of
13	economically needed diversity options for Wyoming (ENDOW) as
14	selected by the governor;
15	
16	(v) A school district superintendent as selected
17	by the governor;
18	
19	(vi) A representative of the governor's office as
20	selected by the governor;
21	
22	(vii) The director of the department of workforce
23	services;

2	(viii) The chief executive officer of the Wyoming
3	business council;
4	
5	(ix) An individual with expertise in the delivery
6	of education to individuals on the Wind River Indian
7	Reservation as selected by the governor;
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9	(x) One (1) member of the Wyoming senate as
10	selected by the president of the senate; and
11	
12	(xi) One (1) member of the Wyoming house of
13	representatives as selected by the speaker of the house.
14	
15	(b) A majority of members of the council shall
16	constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business of
17	the council.
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19	(c) The educational attainment executive council shall:
20	
21	(i) Establish a five (5) year strategic plan and
22	a ten (10) year strategic plan to meet the needs of Wyoming's

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1	businesses and to reach the following educational attainment
2	goals:
3	
4	(A) By 2025, sixty-seven percent (67%) of
5	Wyoming's working population, age twenty-five (25) to
6	sixty-four (64), will possess a valuable postsecondary
7	certificate or degree;
8	
9	(B) By 2040, eighty-two percent (82%) of
10	Wyoming's working population, age twenty-five (25) to
11	sixty-four (64), will possess a valuable postsecondary
12	certificate or degree.
13	
14	(ii) Convene stakeholders to develop the strategic
15	plans;
16	
17	(iii) Convene meetings with stakeholders and the
18	public across Wyoming to obtain necessary information and
19	suggestions on strategic plan elements;
20	
21	(iv) Include an analysis of opportunities
22	coordinated across priority economic sectors as identified by
23	the executive council of ENDOW;

2 (v) Establish appropriate data metrics and

3 performance indicators in the development of the strategic

4 plans and communicate relevant data to the governor, state

5 legislators and the public; and

6

7 (vi) Develop legislative recommendations to

8 present to the joint education interim committee or the joint

9 minerals, business and economic development interim committee

10 to effectuate the strategic plans as necessary.

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12 (d) The educational attainment executive council shall

13 be staffed by the Wyoming community college commission. The

14 University of Wyoming, the seven (7) Wyoming community

15 colleges, the department of education and the department of

16 workforce services shall provide assistance to the

17 educational attainment executive council as the council shall

18 direct.

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20 (e) The educational attainment executive council shall

21 report quarterly on its progress to develop strategic plans

22 to the governor, the board of trustees of the University of

23 Wyoming, the Wyoming community college commission and the

1 executive council of ENDOW. The educational attainment 2 executive council, by September 1 of each year, shall report 3 to the joint education interim committee and the joint 4 minerals, business and economic development interim committee 5 on its progress to develop strategic plans. The council may 6 also, by September 1 of each year, present any proposed education related legislation to effectuate the strategic 7 plans to the joint education interim committee and any 8 9 proposed economic development related legislation 10 effectuate the strategic plans to the joint minerals,

business and economic development interim committee.

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The council shall continue until December 31, 2022, 13 (f) at which point its existence shall cease. Members of the 14 15 council who are legislators shall be paid salary, per diem 16 and mileage as provided in W.S. 28-5-101 for their official 17 duties as members of the council. Subject to constitutional limitations, members of the council who are employees or 18 19 elected officials of the state of Wyoming shall be considered 20 on official business of their agency or office and shall 21 receive mileage and per diem in the manner provided by their agency or office. Any other member of the council shall be 22

1 paid no salary but shall receive mileage and per diem at the

2 same rate as state employees as provided by W.S. 9-3-102.

4 Section 2.

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6 (a) There is appropriated fifteen thousand dollars

7 (\$15,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative service

8 office. This appropriation shall only be expended for

9 providing payments authorized by section 1 of this act to

10 legislative members of the education attainment executive

11 council.

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13 (b) Funds appropriated under this section shall be for

the period beginning with the effective date of this act and

15 ending December 31, 2022. Notwithstanding any other provision

16 of law, funds appropriated under this section shall not be

17 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any

18 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this

19 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30,

20 2022.

Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
