## A BILL

- 1 AN ACT relating to orders of protection; providing for the

- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 7-3-510(b) and 35-21-106(b) are amended
- 9 to read:

- 7-3-510. Service of order; duration and extension of
- 12 order; violation; remedies not exclusive.

- 14 (b) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, an
- order of protection granted by the court under W.S. 7-3-509

1	shall be effective for a fixed period of time not to exceed
2	three (3) years. Either party may move to modify, terminate
3	or extend the order. The order may be extended repetitively
4	upon a showing of good cause for additional periods of time,
5	not to exceed one (1) year three (3) years each, if the court
6	finds from specific facts that a clear and present danger to
7	the victim continues to exist. If a party subject to an order
8	of protection is incarcerated or becomes imprisoned, the
9	running of the time remaining for the order of protection
10	shall be tolled during the term of incarceration or
11	imprisonment. The conditions and provisions of an order of
12	protection shall remain in effect during any period of tolling
13	under this subsection. Upon release from incarceration or
14	imprisonment the effective period of the order of protection
15	shall be the amount of time remaining as of the first day of
16	the term of incarceration or imprisonment or one (1) year
17	from the date of release, whichever is greater.

22 (b) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, an 23 order of protection granted by the court shall be effective

1 for a fixed period of time not to exceed three (3) years. 2 Either party may move to modify, terminate or extend the 3 order. The order may be extended repetitively upon a showing 4 of good cause for additional periods of time not to exceed 5 one (1) year three (3) years each. If a party subject to an order of protection is incarcerated or becomes imprisoned the 6 running of the time remaining for the order of protection 7 8 shall be tolled during the term of incarceration or imprisonment. The conditions and provisions of an order of 9 10 protection shall remain in effect during any period of tolling 11 under this subsection. Upon release from incarceration or 12 imprisonment the effective period of the order of protection 13 shall be the amount of time remaining as of the first day of the term of incarceration or imprisonment or one (1) year 14 from the date of release, whichever is greater. The filing 15 16 of an action for divorce shall not supersede an order of protection granted under this act. 17

19 **Section 2.** This act applies to orders of protection 20 granted, modified or extended on or after July 1, 2019.

Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2019.
