A BILL

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5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 7 **Section 1**. W.S. 21-2-202(a)(xx) and (f), 21-4-302(e),
- 8 21-4-601(d), 21-13-321(d) and 21-16-1307(f)(ii) and (g) are
- 9 amended to read:

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11 21-2-202. Duties of the state superintendent.

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13 (a) In addition to any other duties assigned by law,

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14 the state superintendent shall:

1 (xx) In cooperation with the state board, the 2 Wyoming community college commission, University of Wyoming, 3 public service commission, department of transportation, 4 department of enterprise technology services, public 5 libraries, school district boards of trustees, classroom teachers and other appropriate groups identified by the 6 superintendent, develop and implement a statewide education 7 8 technology plan which shall address staff training, 9 curriculum integration and network connectivity in and 10 between schools, communities and between the state and the 11 world, and which shall have as its goal the provision of equal access to educational instruction and information. 12 The statewide technology education 13 plan may 14 telecommunications services provided by the department of 15 enterprise technology services pursuant to W.S. 9-2-2906(g);-16 Not later than January 10 of each year and with the assistance 17 of participating agencies, an annual report on the status of the statewide education technology plan shall be prepared and 18 19 issued by the state superintendent;

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(f) Not later than October 15 each year, the state superintendent shall prepare a report on the general status of all public schools for the legislature. The report shall

1 include the quality of education including any proposed 2 improvement to address any shortfalls, the relevance of 3 education, the measurement of achievement of educational 4 goals, the improvement of learning and any suggested innovations in education. The state superintendent shall 5 identify professional development needs for Wyoming schools 6 and teachers, based upon the analysis of the quality 7 8 indicators specified under this subsection, establish a plan 9 to address the professional development needs, contract with 10 necessary expertise to provide professional development to 11 Wyoming certified teachers and conduct up to five (5) regional 12 workshops each year providing the identified professional 13 development needs.

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21-4-302. Age for registration in first grade and kindergarten; preschool programs.

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(e) A school district which provides a preschool program under subsection (c) of this section biennially shall assess, through the fourth grade when practical, the school readiness and academic performance of pupils who participate in the program as compared with those who do not participate in the program. The district shall report the results of the

District expenditures 4 computed under subsection (b) of this section shall not 5 include expenditures for employee contributions to the Wyoming retirement system exceeding five and fifty-seven 6 hundredths percent (5.57%) of any member employee's salary. 7 8 The department shall annually review and report to the joint 9 education interim committee regarding services provided to 10 special education students by school districts. The report 11 shall evaluate the extent to which services are being 12 appropriately provided and whether expenditures for services 13 are reasonable in light of charges by providers of similar 14 services in Wyoming. In addition, the department shall when necessary, conduct audits of information submitted by 15 16 districts under this section and may, in accordance with W.S. 17 21-13-307(b), correct the information reported by districts 18 as necessary to fairly and accurately reflect the data type, 19 classification and format required to administer this section 20 in accordance with law and department rule and regulation.

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22 21-16-1307. Success curriculum; test standards.

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1 (f) forth The courses set as success curricula 2 requirements under this article shall be aligned with the 3 student content and performance standards established 4 pursuant to W.S. 21-2-304(a)(iii). The department shall by 5 rule and regulation:

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7 (ii) Establish exceptions as necessary due to good 8 cause to specific coursework within the success curriculum 9 specified under this article for students attending or 10 graduating from an eligible high school or a home-based 11 educational program. In addition, the department shall waive 12 any requirement for success curriculum coursework for fine and performing arts or career-vocational education for honor 13 14 performance scholarship eligibility, upon written 15 certification by the superintendent of a district that these 16 courses are not available in the district to the student. 17 Not later than September 1 each year, The department shall report to the joint education interim committee any waiver 18 19 granted under this section for the immediately preceding 20 school year in its annual report, as required by W.S. 21 21-16-1308(d); and

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1	(g) In each odd-numbered year, the department, in
2	consultation with the University of Wyoming, Wyoming
3	community colleges and the community college commission,
4	shall report to the governor and the joint education interim
5	committee of the legislature on recommendations for
6	modifications to the success curriculum requirements, minimum
7	cumulative GPA and minimum national percentile rank scores or
8	minimum cumulative WORKKEYS scores contained in this article
9	and recommendations for the adoption of statewide student
10	assessment standards and scores to augment qualifying
11	national percentile rankings or WORKKEYS scores, all to
12	ensure that the Hathaway scholarship program is designed to
13	provide the desired incentives for students to pursue a
14	rigorous curriculum and strive to achieve academic success.
15	The report shall also include any additional resources which
16	school districts, particularly those school districts granted
17	exemptions for students under paragraph (f)(ii) of this
18	section, may require to provide the success curriculum. The
19	cumulative GPA requirements for performance under the success
20	curriculum shall not be restricted to those courses
21	comprising the success curriculum, but shall be applied
22	comprehensively to all courses included within each
23	scholarship student's high school curriculum.
