Medicaid expansion study.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to a possible expansion of the Medicaid 2 program; requiring a study of the benefits and costs of 3 expanding the Medicaid program; assigning duties to the 4 insurance department, the department of family services, the 5 department of health and the state library; providing for б actuarial and other studies; providing exceptions to state 7 contracting rules and regulations; setting reporting dates; providing definitions; authorizing an additional position; 8 providing appropriations; and providing for an effective 9 10 date.

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12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 13

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14 **Section 1**.

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1 (a) The insurance department shall conduct a study of 2 the possibility of expanding the Medicaid program including 3 an analysis of the costs and benefits of an expansion subject 4 to the following: 5 (i) Where appropriate and to the extent feasible 6 7 within study cost and time constraints the study shall use 8 actuarial principles in analyzing data and making estimates; 9 10 (ii) The study shall analyze the costs of a 11 conventional Medicaid expansion subject to the following: 12 13 The analysis shall assume: (A) 14 15 (I) The expansion is implemented as of 16 January 1, 2021; 17 18 (II) Rulemaking and obtaining federal permission starts April 1, 2020; 19 20 21 (III) Initial enrollment takes place during the open enrollment period in the fall of 2020; and 22 23

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(IV) The first eligibility for benefits
 is January 1, 2021.

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4 (B) The analysis shall be reported on a
5 calendar year basis through 2026 and on a state fiscal year
6 basis, ending the state fiscal year ending June 30, 2026;
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8 (C) The analysis shall show separately the costs of benefits paid and all other costs labeled as 9 10 administrative costs, as provided pursuant to subsection (d) 11 of this section, and in distinguishing between these shall, 12 to the extent feasible, determine as the federal government 13 does the percentage of the costs federal Medicaid pays. The report shall express these costs as a sum of federal and state 14 15 costs so that report recipients can calculate the separate 16 federal and state costs using their own estimates of the 17 percentage of benefits the federal government will pay. The report shall also include tables showing the costs assuming 18 19 the current federal match for administrative costs with a 20 ninety percent (90%) federal match for benefits, and 21 separately using a fifty percent (50%) federal match for benefits. The tables shall have a summary showing costs by 22 23 both calendar year and fiscal year adding both benefit and

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1 administrative costs together, but showing the federal and 2 state costs separately;

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4 (iii) The study shall, to the extent practical, identify additional cost controls or cost containment 5 measures that an expansion could use with the permission of 6 7 the federal government through a 1115 waiver or otherwise. 8 The study shall indicate how or why the measures would reduce 9 costs or improve quality, but is not expected to include a 10 detailed financial or actuarial analysis of the cost control 11 or cost containment measures;

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13 (iv) The analysis conducted pursuant to paragraph 14 (ii) of this subsection shall consider to the extent 15 practical:

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17 (A) The age and gender distribution of 18 expected new enrollees; 19 20 (B) The health status of expected new 21 enrollees;

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1 (C) The socioeconomic status of expected new 2 enrollees; 3 4 (D) The health care utilization rate, including the effect of previously unmet health needs, of 5 expected new enrollees; and 6 7 8 The experiences of other states that have (E) 9 expanded Medicaid. 10 11 (v) The study shall briefly contrast the results 12 obtained by the analysis done pursuant to paragraph (ii) of this subsection and the study conducted pursuant to 2011 13 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 194, and shall briefly explain 14 the principal differences between the two; 15 16 17 The study shall analyze the increase or (vi) 18 decrease in reimbursement to Wyoming health care providers, 19 especially hospitals and physicians, that would come from the 20 expansion analyzed pursuant to paragraph (ii) of this subsection. The study shall estimate the revenue providers 21 receive from the expansion less any loss in revenue from 22 private insurance coverage, employer based self pay systems 23

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and personal self pay including copayments and deductibles.
The analysis shall show separately any gains or losses to
Wyoming health care providers from coverage and provider
payments for people who will be enrolled in the Medicaid
expansion who are currently receiving subsidized coverage
through the health care exchange and people with other
coverage including employer paid coverage;

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9 (vii) The study shall show for Medicaid and the 10 child health insurance programs any income cliffs where an 11 increase in a person's earnings causes a loss of benefits in 12 excess of the increase in earnings and shall integrate this 13 analysis with a general analysis of government welfare 14 programs for the same effect facilitated with information 15 provided under subsection (b) of this section;

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(viii) The insurance department shall prepare and include in the study a summary of the improvements to health status or lack thereof to the population of individuals who would receive Medicaid coverage due to an expansion of Medicaid. The summary shall be based on the insurance department's own analysis and the state library's literature

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search and the department of health's comments provided under
 subsection (c) of this section.

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4 (b) The department of family services shall furnish the 5 insurance department for inclusion in the study required by 6 subsection (a) of this section a chart or table depicting all 7 government welfare programs paying benefits based on low 8 income and showing the income levels at which benefits are 9 reduced and the extent that this reduction exceeds the 10 additional income earned.

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12 The state library shall conduct a search of the (C) 13 academic literature on the improvements to health status or 14 lack thereof from Medicaid coverage as compared with having no insurance coverage and having private coverage. The search 15 16 shall concentrate on literature quantifying the improvements 17 or lack thereof of the Medicaid program generally and on studies analyzing the experience of the Oregon Medicaid 18 19 expansion immediately before the enactment of the federal 20 reform where Oregon determined based on chance who was to 21 receive the coverage and who was not. The results of this literature search shall be conveyed to the department of 22 23 health and the insurance department for inclusion in the study

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required by subsection (a) of this section. The department of
 health shall forward its comments on the results of the
 literature search to the insurance department for inclusion
 in the study required by subsection (a) of this section.

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(d) department of health shall 6 The furnish the insurance department for inclusion in the study required by 7 8 subsection (a) of this section its estimate of the 9 administrative costs of expanding the Medicaid program 10 including separately the initial start up costs and the 11 ongoing administrative costs. This estimate shall include an 12 estimate of how much of these administrative costs the federal 13 government will provide. The estimate shall assume a conventional Medicaid expansion. 14

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16 (e) Not later than November 15, 2019, the insurance 17 department shall furnish copies of the study to the governor and relevant state agencies, the legislative service office 18 19 for distribution to any legislator requesting a copy, the 20 joint labor, health and social services interim committee and 21 the joint appropriations committee. Copies shall be available to the public in both electronic and hard copy form, and a 22 copy of the study shall be specifically given to any person 23

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1 or group informing the secretary of state's office of their intent to submit an initiative on Medicaid expansion. 2 3 4 (f) As used in this act: 5 "Conventional Medicaid expansion" means an 6 (i) expansion of the Medicaid program that can be achieved by an 7 8 amendment to the Medicaid state plan and does not require a 1115 waiver from the federal government; 9 10 11 (ii) "1115 waiver" means a demonstration waiver of 12 requirements under Medicaid law and regulations that may be 13 obtained from the federal government pursuant to section 1115 of the federal Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. § 1315, which 14 15 governs the Medicaid program. 16 17 (g) In conducting the study, the insurance department is authorized to contract for and use the services of 18 19 consultants and actuaries and is specifically authorized to 20 do so without complying with the state's system for procuring these services. 21 22 23 Section 2.

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2 There is appropriated one hundred fifty thousand (a) 3 dollars (\$150,000.00) from the general fund to the insurance 4 department for the purpose of performing the study and 5 preparing the report required by this act. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of 6 this act and ending June 30, 2020. Notwithstanding any other 7 8 provision of law, this appropriation shall not be transferred 9 or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, 10 unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation shall 11 revert as provided by law on June 30, 2020. This appropriation 12 shall not be included in the department's 2021-2022 standard 13 budget request.

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There is appropriated one hundred ten thousand 15 (b) 16 dollars (\$110,000.00) from the general fund to the insurance 17 department for the purpose of funding one (1) additional position to accomplish the purposes of this act. 18 This 19 appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the 20 effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2020. This 21 appropriation shall only be expended for the purposes of hiring an employee to provide services to further the studies 22 and report required by this act. Notwithstanding any other 23

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1 provision of law, this appropriation shall not be transferred 2 or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, 3 unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation shall 4 revert as provided by law on June 30, 2020. The department of insurance shall include this appropriation in its 2021-2022 5 6 standard budget request, provided that the department requests this appropriation from identified special revenue 7 8 funds. 9 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon 10

10 Deceilor 5. This det is effective immediately upon 11 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as 12 provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution. 13
