## A BILL

for

1	AN ACT relating to state property and buildings; specifying
2	boundaries of the state capitol complex; providing for
3	management and operation of state property and facilities
4	within the state capitol building and state capitol complex;
5	transferring duties and obligations of the state capitol
6	building rehabilitation and restoration oversight group as
7	specified; repealing the existing advisory task force for
8	capitol renovation; amending authority of the state building
9	commission; making legislative findings; repealing executed
10	provisions; specifying legislative areas; restricting
11	alterations of the capitol building and grounds as specified;
12	requiring review of modifications to the master plan for the
13	state capitol complex; and providing for effective dates.
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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 15

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         Section 1. W.S. 9-5-101 by creating new subsections (d)

         (d) The commission shall oversee development of and
    updates to a master plan for maintenance preservation,
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    restoration, rehabilitation, construction and enhancement
    within the capitol complex. The commission shall review all
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    proposals to remodel or construct a building, monument or
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    other improvement within the capitol complex for conformance
    with the master plan. The commission shall notify the
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    management council of the legislature of any proposed

    capitol complex not less than sixty (60) days prior to taking
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    any action to adopt or modify the plan.

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- 14 (a) In order to obtain building sites for additional
- 15 office space and state uses and to insure the proper keeping
- 16 of valuable state records and provide for the expansion of

- 20 sites for future state office buildings. The general services

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4 (e) The state building commission shall not approve of 5 any architectural or structural alteration to the capitol building or grounds without providing notice to the 6 management council of the legislature and without a 7 8 legislative session convening and adjourning after notice was provided to the management council. Routine maintenance and 9 10 repair necessary to keep the capitol building in safe and good working order, including janitorial, grounds keeping and 11 12 maintenance tasks done on a routine basis, shall be conducted 13 in a manner not to alter the capitol building structurally or 14 architecturally to the extent practicable. Major maintenance and repair shall also be conducted in a manner not to alter 15 the capitol building structurally or architecturally to the 16 extent practicable. Emergency maintenance which would 17 structurally or architecturally alter the capitol building 18 19 shall only be undertaken prior to a legislative session 20 convening and adjourning after notification under this 21 subsection if the maintenance is immediately necessary to keep the capitol building in good working order or to prevent 22 harm to the building. The state building commission shall 23

1	provide prior notification to the management council of the
2	legislature of any planned major maintenance activity and
3	shall immediately notify the management council of any
4	emergency major maintenance activity.
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6	(f) In managing areas of the capitol building and
7	grounds and the extension from the capitol building to and
8	under the Herschler building, the state building commission
9	and the management council of the legislature shall enter
10	into memoranda of understanding and other agreements as they
11	determine appropriate to provide effective, comprehensive and
12	coordinated visitor, civic education and other services to
13	the public. The agreements shall also provide for:

15	(i) Maintenance and preservation of the capitol

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22 **Section 3.** On January 1, 2020, the duties and powers of 23 the state capitol building oversight group under W.S. 9-5-109

1 through 9-5-113 as to the state capitol building and Herschler 2 state office rehabilitation, restoration and renovation 3 project described in W.S. 9-5-112, shall be assumed by the 4 state building commission. On January 1, 2020 all appropriations, property, contracts, agreements, obligations 5 6 and authority of the state capitol building oversight group shall be transferred to the state building commission. To the 7 extent a power or duty previously within the authority of the 8 9 oversight group is required to be exercised after December 10 31, 2019, the power or duty shall be exercised by the state building commission in accordance with provisions of law 11 12 governing the project.

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14 Section 4. As the state capitol building and Herschler 15 office building rehabilitation, restoration state renovation project described in W.S. 9-5-112 is completed, 16 17 the Legislature finds that investment of state funds should 18 be safeguarded to the fullest extent possible. The first act 19 of the first Legislature of the state of Wyoming conferred 20 upon the presiding officers of the House and Senate the power 21 to regulate "such parts of the capitol and its passages as 22 are or may be set apart for the use of the Senate [and House] and its officers." 23

2 At the time of enactment of this 1890 statute, "passage" was 3 defined as an avenue leading to the various divisions of a 4 building; "a gallery or corridor or hall". The Century 5 Dictionary, 4314 (1889). The word "hall" at that time was defined as a building, large room or compartment of a building 6 devoted to some public or common use. The 1890 law, enacted 7 8 contemporaneously with the Wyoming Constitution makes clear 9 the authority of the Legislature to oversee common areas of 10 the capitol building connecting its meeting rooms. This is 11 consistent with Wyoming Constitution, Article 3, section 12, 12 which states that the Legislature "shall have all other powers

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15 The legislature occupies more than half of the state capitol 16 building, the underground extension to the capitol building 17 and a portion of the Herschler building. In the renovation of 18 the capitol building, historic legislative meeting rooms were 19 enlarged to accommodate the public. All but two (2) 20 legislative meeting rooms were removed from the second and 21 third floors of the capitol building to the underground extension and to the first floor of the capitol building. 22 Having appropriated millions of dollars to the project and 23

necessary to the legislature of a free state."

1 occupying significant portions of the project for legislative 2 chambers, passages and committee meeting rooms, 3 legislature has great interest in ensuring that the project 4 area is maintained and utilized to the greatest extent 5 possible and the investment protected. At the same time, the governor and other statewide elected officials occupy 6 significant portions of the capitol building and other spaces 7 8 within the project area and have resultant interests in those

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areas.

11 All elected officials and other occupants are, however, but 12 tenants in the "people's house" and no individual or body 13 representing one (1) branch of government should have the 14 ability to modify the historic nature of the capitol building 15 and other components of the capitol square. Maintenance and potential changes to the capitol square are appropriately 16 17 overseen by joint action of executive and legislative 18 representatives. With this enactment the legislature intends 19 to ensure that all legitimate interests in the capitol complex 20 are protected, and most significantly safeguard the 21 overarching interest in the preservation of the historic capitol building and other buildings within the capitol 22 23 square.

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2	Nothing in this act shall be construed to limit the authority
3	of the governor and treasurer under article 3, section 31 of
4	the Wyoming constitution.

8	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this
9	section, this act is effective immediately upon completion of
10	all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by
11	Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
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13	(b) The repeal of W.S. 9-5-110(a)(iii), 9-5-111 and
14	9-5-112(b) under Section 2 of this act are effective January
15	1, 2020.
