SIXTY-FIFTH LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING 2019 GENERAL SESSION

AN ACT relating to administration of government; clarifying that the build Wyoming loan program is a revolving, continuing loan program; clarifying the amount of funds that may be loaned to political subdivisions for infrastructure projects and road or street projects; and providing for an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Section 1. W.S. 16-1-111(a)(intro) is amended to read:

16-1-111. Loans to political subdivisions; requirements; limitations; rulemaking.

(a) The state loan and investment board may negotiate and make loans from the permanent Wyoming mineral trust fund to political subdivisions of this state as provided in this section. The aggregate sum of all <u>outstanding</u> loans made under this section shall not exceed four hundred million dollars (\$400,000,000.00). The aggregate sum of <u>outstanding</u> loans made for infrastructure projects shall not exceed two hundred million dollars (\$200,000,000.00) and shall not exceed two hundred million dollars (\$200,000,000.00) for road or street projects. Loans may be made for infrastructure projects and street and road projects as provided in this section. The board shall adopt rules and procedures as it deems advisable or necessary to administer the program. The rules shall include requirements and standards which the board determines to be necessary or advisable in accordance with the following:
