## FISCAL NOTE

The fiscal impact to the judicial system is indeterminable due to an unknown number of cases.

The Department of Corrections (DOC) also states the fiscal impact is indeterminable. The DOC notes that there is a potential for the length of supervision to decrease for applicable offenders, with potential for corresponding expenditure decreases, as a result of the proposed legislation. However, there are currently no rules to allow for "compliance credit" to be earned for probationers and no method to accurately predict how many offenders would quality. For parolees, under current good time rules, may earn a maximum of 20 days of good time credit per calendar month. The cost for community supervision is approximately \$2,000 per year, per offender.
