FISCAL NOTE

The Wyoming Community College Commission (Commission) indicates if a common application process increased community college enrollment, beginning in academic year 2022, there would be an anticipated revenue increase in the form of student tuition and fees, but is indeterminable.

Additionally, the Commission indicates increased enrollment would increase the weighted credit hours used in the recalibration of the base period of the community college formula, which could lead to an increase in the Commission's standard budget appropriation for community college state aid, but the anticipated increase in is indeterminable.
