## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to county officers and district attorneys;
- 2 prescribing residency requirements for election; prescribing
- 3 when a vacancy in office occurs; providing applicability; and
- 4 providing for an effective date.

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 8 **Section 1**. W.S. 5-3-201, 7-4-101, 9-1-802(b),
- 9 18-3-201(a), 18-3-301(a), 18-3-401, 18-3-501 by creating a
- 10 new subsection (m), 18-3-601, 18-3-801 and 22-18-101(f) are
- 11 amended to read:

- 13 5-3-201. Office created; term; election in counties of
- 14 first and second class; county clerk designated ex officio
- 15 clerk in other counties; qualifications.

2 (a) There shall be a clerk of the district court in 3 each organized county of the state whose term of office shall 4 be four (4) years and until his successor is elected and 5 qualified. Clerks of the district court shall be elected at general elections in counties of the first and second class; 6 and in all other counties the county clerk shall be ex officio 7 8 clerk of the district court, and shall perform all of the duties pertaining to the office of clerk of the district 9 10 court.

(b) A person seeking election as clerk of the district court shall have been a resident of the county in which the person seeks election for at least one (1) year immediately preceding the date of the general election. A clerk of the district court shall be a resident of the county in which the clerk of the district court serves for the duration of the clerk of the district court's term.

22 A coroner shall be elected in each county for a term of four

23 (4) years. A person seeking election as coroner shall have

been a resident of the county in which the person seeks

election for at least one (1) year immediately preceding the

3 <u>date of the general election.</u> He shall take the oath

4 prescribed by the constitution of the state and give bond to

5 the state of Wyoming, in the penal sum of one thousand dollars

6 (\$1,000.00), with sufficient sureties, to be approved by the

7 board of county commissioners, conditioned that he will

8 faithfully perform all duties required by law. A coroner shall

9 be a resident of the county in which the coroner serves for

10 the duration of the coroner's term.

(b) Each district attorney shall have been a licensed attorney for at least four (4) years and a member in good standing of the Wyoming state bar immediately prior to his election. A person seeking election as district attorney shall have been a resident of the judicial district in which the person seeks election for at least one (1) year immediately preceding the date of the general election. A district attorney shall be a resident of the judicial district

- 11 qualified elector resident of the county of election for the

18 (a) In judicial districts in which the office of
19 district attorney has not been created there shall be elected
20 in each county a county and prosecuting attorney who at the
21 time of his nomination and election and during his term of
22 office, shall be a member of the bar of this state. A person
23 seeking election as county and prosecuting attorney shall

have been a resident of a county in which the person seeks 1 2 election for at least one (1) year immediately preceding the 3 date of the general election. A copy of his certificate of 4 election and oath shall be filed by the county and prosecuting 5 attorney with the clerk of the district court for his county or counties. A county and prosecuting attorney shall be a 6 resident of a county in which the county and prosecuting 7 attorney serves for the duration of the county and prosecuting 8 9 attorney's term. In those judicial districts in which the 10 office of district attorney has been created the county commissioners shall appoint an attorney to the office of 11 12 county attorney for a term of one (1) year, who may be 13 reappointed on a year-to-year basis. The county commissioners 14 may remove the county attorney for cause.

A person seeking election as county clerk shall have been a resident of the county in which the person seeks election for at least one (1) year immediately preceding the date of the general election. A county clerk shall be a resident of the county in

2 <u>clerk's term.</u>

7 (m) In addition to any other residency requirement

8 imposed by this section, a person seeking election as county

9 commissioner shall have been a resident of the county in which

10 the person seeks election for at least one (1) year

12 <u>county commissioner shall be a resident of the county in which</u>

13 the county commissioner serves for the duration of the county

14 commissioner's term. A person seeking election as a county

15 <u>commissioner for a commissioner district shall have been a</u>

resident of the commissioner district in which the person

18 the date of the general election and shall be a resident of

19	requirements of this act shall apply to elected or appointed
20	county officers and district attorneys whose terms commence
21	on or after the effective date of this act.
